Today, we listen to the beginning of the 'Sermon on the Mount' which spans chapters five, six and seven of Matthew's Gospel. These three chapters we shall read over the six Sundays before we begin Lent.

Matthew is concerned to portray Jesus as the new and greater Moses. The mountain recalls Mt. Sinai, the sermon's New Law re-interprets the Law of Moses. The Beatitudes occur first place in the sermon just as the ten commandments did in the Law of Moses. The Beatitudes we hear today are an introduction to and indeed a summary, of the Sermon on the Mount.

There are nine beatitudes. Each beatitude describes a different group of people. Each group is blessed because it relies on God and not on itself or its possessions.

As we listen to the Beatitudes, we can imagine ourselves sitting on the mountain above the Lake of Galilee, listening to Jesus as he proclaimed his paradoxes about the poor, those who mourn, the meek, the hungry and thirsty, the merciful, the clean of heart, the peacemakers, the persecuted. They reach a climax in the command: "rejoice and be glad for your reward will be great in heaven." (Matthew 5:12)

OUR SERVICE OF ONE ANOTHER:

In March during our Stewardship Program we will reflect on how we can serve one another in the various ministries within our parish. I recently came across Pope Benedict quoting Cardinal John Henry Newman: "God has created me to do him some definite service. He has committed some work to me which he has not committed to another."

CENTENARY OF THE ECUMENICAL MOVEMENT—1910-2010:

During his recent visit to England and Scotland, Pope Benedict XVI gave his most extended body of ecumenical teaching to date. He recalled the Edinburgh 1910 Missionary Conference, the birth of the modern ecumenical movement and expressed his thanks for the "remarkable progress" so far. He acknowledged "the difficulties that the ecumenical path has encountered" and strongly re-affirmed "the ultimate goal of the restoration of full ecclesial communion." Speaking in Westminster
