What an encouraging note with which we begin today's readings:" If you wish, you can keep the commandments..." We can! We have the capacity to. And God gives us the desire and the grace to do just that. We all make choices; each choice has ongoing implications. Every day we make hundreds of choices, some major decisions, some very simple ones, and many that we do without much thought or attention. But our choices build upon each other, give shape to our days and eventually our life. Each day we write a page of our biography! Do we choose what is life giving or do we choose what stifles life?

God calls us to a radical way of living. We are called to be more than just moral, more than just observe the letter of the law. God calls us to be virtuous. We become virtuous by habitually choosing to do well. We're not perfect, but don't let our failings or our imperfections define us. It's not how many times we fail or fall down that is important, but how many times we pick ourselves up and begin again. That's why we are called to reflect on how we live and to understand what has gone right for us, what leads to life and what leads away. Such reflections, such insight help inform our choices. Living reflectively enables us to grow in wisdom.

Christian wisdom resides in the heart. St Paul, in his letter to the Corinthians, writes of "the hidden wisdom of God", "mysteries", "beyond the mind", "only known through the spirit". These stirrings of the Spirit lead us to a new maturity, to a wisdom that is greater than human insight and imagination, into the silent depths of the presence of God. This is the place of our deepest truth.

In today's Gospel Jesus teaches us that we must live from the heart, the root and source of our inner truth. This is our choice for Life.

Thomas Merton once wrote: "Deep in our hearts is the most profound meaning of our personality, which is that we say 'yes' to God, and the spark is always there. All we need to do is turn towards it an
