OUR CENTENARY AS A PARISH 1911-2011—A HUNDRED YEARS OF PARISH LIVING

Worshipping Together

Although George and Anne Evans married in the Catholic Church in Melbourne in 1842, our first record of parishioners worshipping together at the Eucharist is in 1852 in homes along Oaklands Road. From 1860, Mass was celebrated in the classrooms of O.L.M.C. School. From 1874, Mass was celebrated once a fortnight in O.L.M.C. Church and from 1876 in St Michael's Church, Bulla. In 1990, we began celebrating in St Anne's Church.

In January 1911 Archbishop Thomas Carr, with the approval of his council of senior priests, established the new parish of Sunbury for the people who previously were in the Gisborne and Keilor Parishes (then called Missions). He appointed Fr. John Gallivan as the first parish priest, followed since by thirteen parish priests and ten assistant priests. As people and priests, we have followed Jesus' command at the Last Supper.....'Do this in memory of me'.

Caring for Each Other

In the beginning, parishioners opened their homes to fellow Catholics for worship as noted above.

In times of crisis, e.g. epidemics, the Depression, the World Wars, parishioners have supported each other. There was a long ministry to residents in the Psychiatric Hospital each Saturday. There is an extensive ministry to our fellow Catholics in the four aged care facilities.

Our recent development of neighbourhoods has seen active support for those within their neighbourhoods during bereavement and in care for the housebound.

Working Together

Volunteers have been the life blood of our parish life—much unseen. A key area has been fundraising in various styles—Bazaars (1901) Queen carnivals (1930's) fetes, planned giving (since 1962) and now Stewardship. As we give thanks for the past 100 years, we look forward as Stewards towards the next 100 years.

Learning Together

Since 1860, we have had a Catholic School for our children. In 1929, Salesian College was established for secondary education. In 1976, St Anne's School opened.

Like most Australian parishes, providing Catholic education has been a priority and focus of parish life.

Since 1980's, the Catechumenate has been followed here and the R.C.I.A. has been celebrated for adults.

As friends together

In the 100 years, many social groups have been the setting for making friendships: CYMS, Y.C.W., N.C.G.M., Catholic Ladies' Guild, Majellan Club, Tennis Club, Youth Groups, K.S.C., Marriage Encounter,

Blessing of our new facilities at O.L.M.C. School

This took place yesterday as part of the 150 years celebration of the school. On 24 February 2009, Mark Gleeson (Acting Principal) and myself decided to accept the Federal Government's offer of \$2 million as part of the Building Education Revolution.

We engaged the Architects Smith & Tracey and plans were developed. Work began with moving classrooms in September 2009 and later demolishing two classrooms so that they could be replaced with four. Where a portable classroom used to be, a double storey was built. Hence there was no loss of playground. Being a school site since 1860, there were significant needs to upgrade electricity and fire service—this added to the cost. Consequently the school has some very large loans to be repaid over the next ten years.

Parents and visitors have been overwhelmed with the new facilities including the capacity to provide out of school hours care. The school has the facilities for education in the 21st century.
