LOSS OF TWO PARISH PRIESTS

Fr. John Maher O.M.I., 62 years old (Sunshine) and Fr. Tony Hally, 73 years old (Woodend) have recently returned to the Father. Fr. John was also a fine lecturer in theology and Fr. Tony, as well as parish duties, was for many years on a diocesan committee involved with Catholic Schools. Due to the lack of priests, their vacant positions have not been filled.

TRINITY SUNDAY

It was not until the first great Ecumenical Council, consisting of 318 bishops from all parts of the then Christian world, meeting in the city of Nicaea, near modern Istanbul in Turkey in the year 325, that the formal teaching of the Church about God as Trinity started to take shape. This came about in an effort to clarify many misunderstandings about the relationships between Father, Son and Spirit, and from our point of view, misunderstandings about our relationship with God, as revealed by Jesus.

The Old Testament, the Hebrew Scriptures, taught what God was like – that he constantly loved and rescued his people, despite their rejection and half-heartedness in keeping the Law which had been given to them. That God was creator of all, all powerful, glorious beyond measure, and that he had chosen a people to be his own. After the Resurrection, the disciples came to recognize that whatever could be said about God as revealed in the (Hebrew) Scriptures could be said about Jesus. St. John reflects this in his Gospel: 'The Father and I are one.' The same life that the Father had, Jesus also had. In a similar way they came to recognize through their own experience that the Holy Spirit had this same life and dwelt within them, and they in the Spirit. This notion of many persons sharing one life is not so alien to us - it is the foundation stone of marriage, and of all communities.

We believe that God is not 'solitary', 'separate' or 'remote' but it is God's very nature to be in constant and boundless loving inter-personal relationship. And, as the Book of Genesis recounts right at the beginning, we are made in God's image, and so we too have the capacity to participate in an inter-personal relationship with the Father, through the Son, in the Spirit.

This 'image' in us is destroyed by sin, and as St Paul says, is restored by Christ in Baptism. We are 'in Christ' - a phrase which St. Paul uses over 160 times in his letters - because he has given us the free gift of his Spirit.

It is very appropriate then, that this feast follows immediately after Pentecost, when we recalled the beginnings of the Christian community, the Church. It forcibly reminds us that we are made, and constantly called by God, to be in an ever developing and deepening relationship with God and with each other, and that this is brought about in and by the power of the Holy Spirit, who is God in us.

Here is St. Athanasius, Archbishop of Alexandria, who was at the great Council of Nicaea as a young man and became the great defender of its teaching:

'Because of the free gift of the Spirit which has been given to us, we come to be in the Spirit and the Spirit in us; and since the Spirit is God's Spirit, we recognise that we, having the Spirit, should be considered to be 'in God' through the Spirit who has been given to us. Not that we come to be in the Father in the same way that the Son is in him. The Son is in the Father as being his own Word and radiance but we, apart fromcont

cont.....the Spirit, are separate and apart from God, and are united with God by participation in the Spirit; so that our being in the Father does not belong to us, but to the Spirit, who is in us, and dwells in us.' And that is why we say: Alleluia!
