"A FIRE BURNING IN MY HEART".....Jeremiah

Today we see Jeremiah in a very depressed state. The word which he has been given to say to the leaders and to the people is that, if they want to avert disaster, political, social and religious, they need to change their behaviour in fundamental ways. They need to put justice and care for others before their own enjoyment, comfort and priorities. For his efforts Jeremiah has received nothing but criticism. Does that sound familiar?

Paul says the same to the Roman church: 'Do not model yourselves on the behaviour of the world around you, but let your behaviour change, modified by your new mind.' And Jesus is less compromising than either Jeremiah or Paul: 'Anyone who wants to save his life will lose it, but anyone who loses his life for my sake will find it'.

What would Jeremiah, Paul and Jesus say to us if they were to preach at Mass this weekend? They would say just what they said to the people of their time and place, as we have heard them speak today. As we give thanks for, and celebrate the lives and work of the Sisters of Saint Joseph in our parish, particularly for the life and work of Sisters Maureen and Mary, we are reminded sharply once again, as we have been reminded by them in past years, that they have taken to heart what Jeremiah, Paul and Jesus said today and made this the foundation of their lives. They have laid down their lives for others; their behaviour has been radically at odds with the popular concepts of 'normal' behaviour; - and they would be embarrassed to read this and think that what they have done and lived is little enough in comparison with what they have received!

What does all this mean for each of us personally as members of this parish community? It means that we must be constantly prepared to change the way we think and behave as members of this community. If this community is to continue to grow and to be a source of life to us and to future generations we need to be much more realistic about how we participate in its life. It is no longer possible for parishes to survive on the dedicated efforts of a few while the majority are 'consumers' of parish 'services'. That is the 'behaviour of the world around us'. Let me suggest two 'changes in behaviour' that will require a certain amount of 'dying' to our own priorities:

Next Saturday morning we will hold our annual Parish Assembly. Will only the same 'few' make the effort to come along and help frame the future life of this community?

The staff of our Parish Primary Schools do an excellent job in preparing the children to celebrate the Sacraments of Initiation into the life of our community, but there is a very small response from other members of the community when assistance with welcoming these children and their families is requested. While it is clearly the responsibility of our teachers and catechists to educate the children, it is the responsibility of the whole community to assist in practical ways with the preparation for, and initiation of these children and their families into our community. Next year, there will be many opportunities to offer simple but very important assistance. Take an active part in this important work.

OUR COMMUNION PROCESSION

As we approach the Eucharistic Table of the Lord to receive the Body and the Blood of Christ, we sing if possible and one communicant from the front we make a bow of our head in humility (not a profound bow from the waist) and then look at the Host and express our faith by saying "Amen". This is as the Australian Bishops have taught. Genuflecting is a health hazard to our fellow communicants as there is the possibility of tripping the person behind when we stick our leg out behind us to genuflect. There is no need to bow again when receiving the Cup of the Blood of Christ as Christ is already present within us at this stage.

A RENEWED MENTALITY WITH NEW MASS TEXTS
