

#### TWENTY- NINTH SUNDAY OF ORDINARY TIME

The reading today from the Prophet Isaiah, written at the end of the Exile in Babylon, (538BC) draws the attention of the people to the fact that God is at work in the events of history, caring for his people. The Persians were in the process of overrunning the Babylonian empire, and the coming of the new regime, with a different policy towards minority groups within their empire, provided the opportunity for the remnant of God's people to begin to return to their own land and to set about the task of reconstructing their society.

By Jesus' time it is becoming clear that there are deep flaws in the society which has been built after the return from Babylon and in the underlying way of looking at the world around them which the leaders of the people in particular have adopted. They have a sense of moral superiority, a sense that they are 'right' and that all the rest of the world is 'wrong'. They have a sense that they alone have been chosen by God, and that God only works through them and through their way of doing things. It is this distorted sense of their place in the world, their place in God's plan for all creation, which leads them into conflict with the good news which Jesus proclaims - that God's love is unbounded and for all.

The letter to the little church in Thessalonica illustrates the fruit of the Gospel: 'faith in action . . work for love . . . persevere through hope in our Lord Jesus Christ.' We see the ruthlessness of the scheming of the leaders as they seek to entrap Jesus, because they recognise that the gospel is a direct challenge to their self importance and life of privilege. Jesus is fully 'aware of their malice'. His response is contained in those powerful words, 'You hypocrites!' What was the tone of voice in which he said these words? Anger? Accusation? Or was it rather a deep sigh of sadness that they had so completely missed the point of all that their own spiritual tradition stood for, and in so doing had destroyed their own humanity and the vitality of their society?

Jesus makes no distinction between the secular and the sacred, between Jew and Roman. Jesus proclaims the kingdom of his Father in which all are brothers and sisters, all have a responsibility to work in faith, and hope and love for both the material and spiritual good of all.

Attached to this Newsletter is a summary of the reflection which Father Michael has been presenting on the nature and meaning of Eucharist while he has been with us. The 'model' of Eucharist shown there reminds us that we are to 'model' our way of living on what we do when we gather, listen, give thanks, are fed, are sent out into a needy world. St. Augustine's words inspire us to strive to have an ever deeper appreciation of what it is that God is calling us to and offering us. Living a 'Eucharistic' life is to 'give to Caesar what belongs to Caesar, and to God what belongs to God'.
