## THIRT-FIRST SUNDAY OF ORDINARY TIME

Today's reading from the Book of the prophet Malachi, written in a time like ours in many ways, and the words of Jesus in the Gospel, should strike 'fear and trembling' into the heart of every bishop, priest and religious leader. Malachi (his name means 'My Messenger') wrote about 50 or 60 years after the great religious renewal and fervour of the return of Israel from Babylon, the rebuilding of the Temple and the establishment of a strong and very centralised religious system, based in Jerusalem and focussed on the Temple and its priests. After 50 or 60 years, the interior energy for renewal has been replaced by an authoritarian system of requirements, designed to ensure that the ordinary people are constantly reminded of their religious obligations.

While the original intent of these requirements was good, they had become an end in themselves for many and had lost their significance. In the case of Israel, they were never able to extract themselves from this religious 'system'. It persisted till Jesus' time, and ordinary people were only able to escape from it by entering into the radical freedom of the new Christian communities which Saint Paul describes so vividly in his letters. This truly radical freedom, based on recognition that all in the community are equal as brothers and sisters, living members of one living Body, parts of one another and all indispensible to all others, was terrifying to many who had grown up in the highly structured Jewish system. We are familiar with this kind of 'terror' in Australia. For most, from the arrival of the first European settlers 220 years ago, the vast uncharted interior was a source of uneasiness, even fear, so they clung to their familiar surroundings on the coast. Only a few dared, at some risk to themselves, to venture into, and experience the wonder of the great interior. As we endeavour to build up our parish community we need to ensure that we build on the foundation stones which Jesus and Paul have laid. The basic element of this building is that we 'recognise the Body' as St. Paul says in his first letter to the Corinthians (11.29), that we recognise the dignity of each other as sisters and brothers, as children of the one God and Father. It is difficult to establish these relationships which must necessarily be 'personal' – nodding acquaintance is not nearly good enough – in a large group. There is a saying: 'You cannot love what you do not know'.

It is precisely in order to provide an opportunity for such genuinely personal relationships – friendships – to grow, that we are working towards establishing a sense of connection between those in our parish who live near us in our more local neighbourhood. Of course there will be some who say, 'I don't want that kind of relationship with my neighbours. I just want to go to church to pray.'. They will need to take that up with Paul and with Jesus! Attached to the newsletter this week is a summary report of the Annual Parish Assembly held last month. It gives a good indication of the generous efforts of many in our community who are working together to establish the kind of friendships and co-responsibility which we see in the scriptures. As you will see, there are many opportunities to participate more actively in the life of the community.

Also advertised elsewhere in this Newsletter is the invitation that has been extended to the families of children who celebrated their first Reconciliation and Communion this year to come together with others in their Neighbourhoods for Mass on the next two Sundays. There will be refreshments before Mass and you are invited to come along and meet with them.
