SECOND SUNDAY OF ADVENT

Christmas Mass at Rupertswood Stadium - 7pm, Saturday December 24: If there are any children in Years 1 to 4 attending schools other than Our Lady of Mt. Carmel or St. Anne's who would like to take part in the dramatisation of the Gospel at this Mass - there is always room for angels and shepherds! - ask mum or dad to ring the Parish Office on Monday 5 December to let us know. We have sent a not to children at the parish primary schools. Today we hear the beginning of St. Mark's Gospel. His is the first of the four Gospels to be written and the shortest - and he wastes no time getting to the heart of his subject: All of the expectations of the Hebrew people, all their hopes and longing, have been fulfilled! There is a great urgency in his story. The people have been waiting for centuries for the Messiah to come - and now he is here and it is time to recognise this and to respond by a complete transformation in the way that we live! This is 'Good News'! Don't miss the opportunity! Last week we heard Jesus calling us to keep our eyes open - to stay awake - to be attentive to God's call to us and to God's saving work in us and in the world. Now we see the people coming to hear John, the 'Baptiser', or as he is called in the Orthodox Churches, the 'Forerunner', calling the people to repentance. They are responding to his call, being immersed in the Jordan as a symbol of their hope and prayer that their way of living will be transformed.

The symbolism of going into, and coming out of this river was not lost on them. In the ancient story that was the basis of their spiritual and cultural life, 'crossing the Jordan' was the point of fulfilment at the end of the long journey that had started, first with a promise long before to Abraham, then with a dramatic escape from slavery. Then there had been a journey to 'the mountain of God' where they had received the Law, and a whole generation of wandering in the desert, learning to cope with this new relationship with God and finding it far from straightforward or easy! At last Joshua brings them to this river, a river that even Moses could not cross, and they go into it in the desert and come out of it in the promised land 'where milk and honey flow!'

Then they realise that the task of building a new society, a new way of living, is before them and it will require all the energy and imagination that they can muster - but they are slaves no longer. They are free women and men with a vision of a just and faithful society, and with the confidence that they are not alone in this enterprise but that it is the enterprise of the Living God.

John immediately points beyond his call to repentance - that is essential and critical but not the whole story - in fact, not even a shadow of the whole story! The one who is coming after him will not only set past wrongs right, but will offer much more than the possibility of building a righteous society, symbolised by crossing the Jordan. He will offer the ability to individuals and to communities to enter into, not a country, but into the boundlessly life-giving, creative, redemptive and transforming life of God's own daughters and sons, sharing in God's own life - life 'in the Holy Spirit'.Richard Hallett
