PREPARE ANEW

John the Baptiser presents an uncompromising message: 'Repent, for the kingdom of heaven is close at hand'. John also presents an uncompromising image of the radically dedicated man, living an extreme lifestyle on the edge of society, and this can itself be deceptive. We can have an image of the repentance that is called for being somehow linked to changing our lifestyle and becoming something of an extremist. But both Isaiah and Saint Paul give a clear picture of the kind of repentance that John and Jesus call for so insistently.

Paul calls for three things:

Perseverance: 'May God help you when you refuse to give up' - but refuse to give up in doing what?

Forbearance: 'Be tolerant with one another'

Friendship: 'Treat each other in the same friendly way as Christ treated you'

Perseverance in forbearance (that is, in gracious acceptance of others as they are) which grows into genuine friendship. This is the great 'new vision' which Jesus, John and Isaiah put before us in this Advent season, this season of preparing for new beginnings. John and Jesus are scathing in their criticism of those who see religious practices as more important than this. Religious practices are important and helpful, even necessary, to support us in coming precisely to this way of living, but they are not an end in themselves.

Isaiah describes the one on whom the spirit of God rests. The description which he gives of the Messiah is precisely the description which the Church takes up in describing every initiated disciple of Christ - the seven gifts of the Spirit of God. Isaiah and Paul are of one mind: 'He does not judge by appearances . . . with equity he gives judgment for the poor of the land.' Isaiah then paints that remarkable picture of the earth transformed - 'calf and lion cub feed together' - the 'kingdom of heaven' which is near at hand and which is brought into being only by uncompromising perseverance in forbearance which grows into true friendship.

The Jesse Tree is hung with ornaments representing Old Testament people and events, and lead up to Jesus. The traditional symbols hung on the tree are based on the genealogy of Jesus as recounted by the first chapter of the Gospel of St Matthew.
