The 24th of August this year marks the 450th anniversary of the founding of the Carmelite community of St. Joseph's in Avila, Spain, by St. Teresa. The story of what led to the establishment of this extraordinary community and what Teresa's hopes and guiding principles were in establishing it are fascinating; perhaps more relevant to us today than we might imagine. Teresa is remembered as a 'mystic' - a person who had an extraordinary experience of the closeness of God in her life. She would not be too impressed with the popular understanding of who she was and what was important to her! - in fact she said so many times!

While she certainly did have a deep sense of God's love for her, she was very conscious that she was not 'someone special', at least that her relationship with God had very little to do with her own efforts, but was an unexpected and undeserved gift which had been given to her. It is because she was very aware of her own ordinariness, and indeed of her own inadequacies and failings, that she was convinced that such an extraordinary gift was offered to everyone, but was rarely recognised or accepted or properly fostered, and so she set about creating an environment for women and men of her time in which responsiveness to this gift was supported and fostered.

Creating and nurturing an environment in which the inner life of people, young and old, with a great diversity of personal experience, some of it full of wonder, some of it full of struggle, is the primary responsibility of Christians in every time and in every place. In a society like ours which is so busy with external stimulation - advertising, TV, radio, mobile phones, sms, twitter, work, shopping, sport - the development of inner life and strength is an ever present and pressing challenge because, ultimately, and despite the external pressures, it is the quality of our inner life, guiding our choices and relationships, which will determine the quality and the course of our lives. As we get out of 'holiday mode' it is time to take up this work of building such an environment again!

In two and a half weeks we begin 'the joyful season' of Lent - an opportunity to put some focus and some effort into developing our inner life, even at some cost to our outer selves which seem to require most of our attention most of the time! One key foundation stone of Teresa's communities has always been to simply set aside some time each day for inner life. I, like her, hesitate to call this 'prayer' because that is likely to be immediately interpreted as the need for us to 'do something'. But we find it so hard to simply be still and let our inner life happen that some form of 'doing something' is often helpful to start with. There is a form of 'doing something' to help inner life grow that will be offered at Our Lady of Mt. Carmel Church on Wednesday evenings during Lent that you might like to come along and try. It is called the 'Prayer of the Church', takes about 10 minutes a day and anyone can do it with a little practice and perseverance. We will take a look at how this works next time. but in the meantime, think about how you might set aside some time during Lent for, as St. Paul says and prays, 'your inner self to grow strong.'

**OUR PRAYERFUL SYMPATHY:** We offer to the family and friends of Fr Peter Fulton who entered eternal life suddenly on Friday morning. In 1945 Peter was born the youngest of four children to Chris and Muriel. After education at Holy Eucharist School Chadstone and St. Kevin's College Toorak, he was accepted as a student for the priesthood along with forty others including me in 1963. After ordination in 1970, he served in the parishes of Dandenong and Doncaster before being asked to go to the Melbourne Overseas Mission in Papua New Guinea as he was an outstanding linguist. Even this year, he was enrolled at La Trobe University to study Greek. In November 1978 while in New Guinea he became a paraplegic as a result of an aeroplane crash near Lae. After a year of rehabilitation in the Austin and later with his mother, he was appointed to the parish of Blackburn and later to the Victorian seminary at Clayton. In 1988, he was appointed parish priest of Mt. Eliza. In 2001, he retired and came to live at Greensborough North Parish with me. In 2011, he moved into the loving care of the Little Sisters of the Poor, who were present as he passed to the Lord while at the Austin Hospital. He lived life to the full, loving the arts and studying languages amidst his declining health. Let us rejoice as he goes to the house of the Lord. (Psalm 122)
