### Newsletter - 3rd Sunday of Lent - Year B - 10-11 March 2012

We see Jesus, at the beginning of St. John's Gospel and so at the beginning of his public ministry, going up to the Temple at Passover, as he would again at the conclusion of his public ministry. This incident is the very first action of Jesus, after he had called his first disciples and after the wedding at Cana. It is therefore of great significance.

Jesus had been to Jerusalem for Passover every year of his life so seeing the traders in the Temple was nothing new to him. It is not as if he suddenly lost his temper. This action was clearly premeditated. It was intended as a 'sign'. But a sign of what?

Jesus clearly considered the highly centralised, dominating Temple worship of his time a betrayal of the covenant which God had made with his People as a source of life and freedom - as we heard in the first reading. The notion that God could only be approached in one place, through only one ritual process controlled by one group of powerful people was abhorrent to him. This process was directed more at establishing national and personal prestige for those in power rather than enabling people to establish a true relationship with God as their Father.

So Jesus announces his presence by quite literally turning the tables on what is happening in Jerusalem. This is a public declaration that he has come to overturn those religious practices which hold people bound in fear and a state of dependence, and without dispensing with the true intention of the Law and the Prophets, to usher in a new relationship with God, as we will see two chapters later in John's Gospel, on a hot day by Jacob's Well, when he says to the Samaritan woman, 'The hour will come - in fact it is here already - when true worshippers will worship the Father in spirit and truth; that is the kind of worshipper the Father wants.'

Within forty years (70AD) the Temple would be destroyed by the Romans in response to continual Jewish attempts to establish their national independence. The destruction of the Temple put an end to worship based on animal sacrifice. Jewish religious practice was forced to adapt to a changed world, and as time passed, despite a nostalgic longing for a past that would never return, they were able to retain a faithful relationship with God.

The new temple of which Jesus spoke is the temple of his body, and we are his body in which his Spirit dwells,

We hear this account at this central point in Lent because Lent is an opportunity to upset the tables on things that might make us feel comfortable but which are not contributing to our ability to respond appropriately in service to the real needs of our time. .....Richard Hallett
