## 17th Sunday of Ordinary Time - 28-29 July 2012

In the readings today Elisha feeds the Brotherhood of the Prophets abundantly with what his servant thinks is a totally inadequate amount of bread. Jesus feeds the crowd with the seemingly insignificant gift offered by a small boy - five barley loaves (like small bread rolls) and two [dried] fish! In the second reading St. Paul urges us; 'Do all you can to preserve the unity of the Spirit by the peace that binds you together.' Why is this so important? Because we need to realise that we are all members of one Body; we all share the one Spirit. We are not individuals any more - the life that we have now as Christians is one that we all share with each other. We are responsible for one another. If any one of us ignores our responsibility, the life of all the others is impaired, weakened, damaged.

As we prepare for our Parish Assembly on 1 September, to which we are all invited, and following on from what we considered last week as we celebrated our Parish Feast day of St. Mary of Carmel and St. Anne, here are a few thoughts on what this responsibility we have for each other involves and how we might take this responsibility seriously.

Last week we mentioned the importance of simply taking part in the life of the parish community. This is difficult if we do it on an individual basis - just because we think we have an obligation to do something. It works much better if we participate out of a sense of personal commitment to other members of the community, as well as out of a personal commitment to Jesus. We come together, not because we feel obliged to, but because we recognise that others benefit from our mere presence [we often find that hard to believe!!] and that we benefit from being with them. And why is that? Just as in marriage, as we read way back in the Book of Genesis, wife and husband become 'one body', so it is with every Christian community. Each of us is radically incomplete without the others. We complement one another. Together we make up one living body.

This also means that we are all different, and that each of us brings something unique and irreplaceable to the life of the community. [We find this hard to believe too!] Each of us is 'graced', given 'abundant freely given gifts', in a unique way. No one else has the same gifts. And it is through bringing these gifts together and sharing them that both the sharers and the receivers of the various gifts are made complete and whole.

We have seen that there are three foundational elements to the life of every Christian community:

- Participation based on personal commitment to one another in Christ.
- Recognition that each of us is responsible for the others. A community cannot survive and be healthy if this responsibility is left to a few.
- Recognition that each member of the community has unique gifts which have been given to them not for their own benefit but for the benefit of all the others.

The surprising experience of every community that pays attention to these has foundational elements is that the gifts of those who participate in the life of the community with a sense of co-responsibility for each other are entirely adequate - in fact abundant - for meeting the needs of the community - and there will be plenty left over to share with those beyond the community itself.
