18th Sunday in Ordinary Time

Last Sunday we heard how the crowd was amply fed by the multiplication of the loaves and fishes. Today, we continue to listen to John's Gospel (6:24-35) in which the people come looking for more food. Jesus, as always in John, is aware of their shallow motives, seeking only to fill their bellies rather than looking for the true meaning of Jesus' actions or the mystery behind the signs.

Jesus says to us "Work for the food- the Son of Man will offer you." The Father will lift up Jesus at the resurrection and the bread of the risen Christ will give eternal life. Receiving the Eucharist is a pledge of eternal life.

A Communion Reflection

When the crowd had eaten, Jesus told the disciples to gather up the fragments so that nothing would get lost. As we come to the end of this celebration, let us pause for a few moments to recall something that has made an impression on us this morning. It may be a word from the homily, a phrase from a hymn or the sight of a member of the community. Let us bring it from this morning's Mass as a fragment of the bread of life to sustain us during the week ahead. May it remind us that we too have eaten in the presence of the Lord.

Spirituality of Sport- Olympics

During the 20th Century, there was a movement from a sceptic view of sport to a more positive one. St Pius X, when Archbishop of Venice (1893-1903) organised a "regatta of gondoliers." Pope John Paul II, a keen sportsman who still skied as Pope, taught the holistic value of "integral human development." Recent popes have referred to sport as "gymnasium of virtue" and as an opportunity to celebrate peace, goodwill and universal human fraternity. The Vatican has a section devoted to faith and sport.

St Paul used sporting metaphors to describe our journey to salvation— a journey where like elite sportspersons, we defer gratification, even tolerate pain and persecution as we strive for eternal life. On our journey of life, may we strive to be like true sportspersons, generous and gracious in victory as in defeat.

NEIGHBOURHOODS IN ENGLAND: "We have now realised that we need a cell system based on where people live. This "local church" needs a leader who is trained to coordinate the needs of that particular neighbourhood. We rarely take account of the fellowship that neighbours can exercise in their baptismal priesthood which is often carried out in many wonderful ways.
