Second Sunday of Advent:

Our Gospel reading (Luke 3:4-6) gives us the geographic and political details of the place of Jesus' coming into our world. It is a concrete event in time and place, not some vague notion.

We are introduced to John the Baptist's ministry of preaching God's word. Though John lived out in the wilderness, the word he received was not for himself only, but was to be shared. His message then and today, especially in this hectic season, is to have a new beginning to prepare our hearts to realign our road so that Christ's coming into our lives is made easier.

Next Wednesday evening, we shall gather in our church to reflect and quietly prepare our inner selves for Christmas in our Advent Penitential (non-sacramental) Service. In recent years, a similar service has been very well appreciated.

Our Advent Wreath

As the school children entered the church last Wednesday, there were "Wows" as they saw our new wreath of native flowers and the five Advent candles. The latest research puts the beginning of the Advent wreath in 1839 in Hamburg by a Lutheran pastor. In the 1920's Catholics in Germany adopted the devotion. The circle represents the eternity of God without beginning or end. The purple candle represent the weeks of Advent; the pink being a sign of joy– Joyfulness Sunday– 3rd Sunday. The white candle represents Christ the light of the world to be lit on Christmas Day.

We are grateful to Cathie Lio, Mary Macdermid, Jo Spiteri and Jo Wiegerink for their work on the new Advent Wreath.

"Led By The Spirit"

Is the title of a history of our parish (96 pages). Launched last Sunday, the book begins with the first carers of our land and their history in Sunbury. The production has been carried out by members of our parish historical committee: Joan and Joe Koren, Mary and Ron Macdermid and myself. Our chief researcher was Tracie Oldham; the format was done by Amanda Best. Many parishioners gave photos and taped their memories and were typed by Joan. The book covers our schools, Eucharistic Festival, Italian POW's, Parish Social life, and has many colour photos. The books are sold at cost price (\$20) and a third were sold after two Masses last Sunday.

will be held each evening prior to Christmas. Mass will be celebrated at 6.30pm from Monday 17 December, generally at OLMC Church on weeknights, except 18 December which will be at St Anne's. From the 17 December, the focus of Advent moves to Mary and Christmas. The Church has a special liturgy from 17 December to 25 December.

A SIGN OF HOPE— A QUIET VOICE OF ASIA: Last month, the Pope appointed Cardinal Luis Tagel of Manila aged 55 years, one of the youngest cardinals. He is known for his cycling around Manila to see and experience the tears and smiles of the people he serves. He speaks several languages and has a doctorate in Theology from Catholic University in Washington DC. At the Synod of 240 Bishops in Rome in November, his presentation included "The Church cannot and must not pretend to have easy answers to the dilemmas facing men and women today. Instead, it must be an attentive and listening Church—only that way will people believe that God listens to them too." He went on: "The Church must be a humble Church, modelling herself more on Jesus and being less preoccupied by her power, prestige and position in society."
