Second Sunday in Ordinary Time

This Sunday is the third January Sunday in a row where there is a manifestation, a revelation of who Jesus is. Firstly, Jesus was revealed to the wise men from the East as the Saviour of all peoples, not only the chosen Jews. Secondly, at his baptism recalled last Sunday, Jesus is revealed as the beloved Son of the Father. Today, Jesus is revealed as the Messiah who has come. The Messianic banquet has began as Jesus changed an extraordinary amount of water (680 litres) into wine. The abundance of God is already available. This is a sign of the overflowing of God's love into human history. Our baptismal font overflowing water is a sign of God's never-ending abundance to us.

GUESTS AT THE WEDDING OF CANA

St John's Gospel (2:1-11) describes the wedding at Cana, in northern Galilee. In those days, the feast lasted several days and naturally the guests were expected to bring their own food.

Mary the mother of Jesus alerts her son to the embarrassing shortage of wine and places the resolution of the problem into his hands. To us, Jesus calling his mother "Woman" may seem odd. Maybe Jesus is alluding to the Eve in the Garden of Eden where Eve is called "The Woman". Hence, Jesus appears to address Mary as the New Eve and the mother of the Messiah. Later at the cross. Jesus again called his mother "Woman".

A BRIGHT FUTURE

In our current world of economic recession and institutional scandals, today's reading speaks of a bright future measured not by economics but by transformation and enriching power of God's love for us all.

REFLECTION

Things can change: water can become wine, families can be reconciled, justice can replace violence, peace can cover the land. And people can change when they get a chance. Love can change hardness of heart into compassion, prayer can change a selfish style of life into generosity. With the touch of Jesus water can change into wine, and men and women can change, and become like God. (D Neary, Communion Reflections, 1997, p.52)

LIVING OUT OF MARRIAGE

Is the way most baptised people grow in holiness. Each partner gives and receives love from the other thus giving life to each other. Marriage is a Sacrament or sign just as Christ loves the Church, giving himself up for us, so husband and wife love each other. Their love is a sign of God's love for us—unending and fruitful as St Paul taught. In the 20th Century, our theological appreciation of marriage has grown. In addition, there has been more appreciation of the aspects of relationship. Our Melbourne Archdiocese has specialised marriage educators to lead engaged couples into a deeper and more loving relationship. Most couples speak very appreciatively of these courses after they have completed them.
