PALM SUNDAY- 24 MARCH 2013

Each of the four evangelists show different dimensions of Christ's Passion. Today, we are listening to Luke's account (22:14-23:56). The Passion of Luke reveals a Passion that is marked by healing and forgiveness. It is only in Luke that we have the consoling of the women of Jerusalem and of the good thief, "Today you will be with me in paradise." and the forgiveness of his executioners.

Luke portrays Jesus, above all, as one who by his Passion brings healing and reconciliation to creation. Luke has the famous parables of the lost coin, lost sheep and the lost Prodigal Son. Luke has women in major roles. These themes colour his presentation of the Passion, a defining moment in Jesus' life.

This one feast, the greatest and most ancient of all our feasts, is a three day feast like three chapters in a book as we follow the last days on earth of Jesus, as he celebrates the Passover, washing the feet and giving us a sacramental memorial of his death and resurrection in the Eucharist as we recall his suffering and venerate the Cross on Friday and as we await his rising from death on Saturday evening. The liturgy is designed as a continuous celebration beginning on Thursday and ending on Saturday with the final blessing.
