# **Seventeenth Sunday in Ordinary Time**

Today, we hear Jesus teaching us through Luke's gospel (11:1-13) the most popular and probably the briefest prayer used by all Christians: The Lord's Prayer which has only 38 words. These few sentences have changed history.

Luke's gospel has six major themes: prayer, hospitality, compassion, forgiveness, the common life and care for the outsider. Most of these themes are expressed is these 38 words

In the "Our Father", we declare we belong to God in the most intimate of ways, as members of God's family and therefore we belong to each other. We pray that God's Kingdom will come here and now, and, through our gratitude for God's generosity and forgiveness, we can be saved from evil.

The Lord's Prayer was incorporated into our Mass very early. Experts say it should be recited rather than sung, as we can all speak, not all can sing.

The Lord's Prayer, like all prayers, is not said to change God, but rather us. By asking God in prayer, we acknowledge that all things are in God's hands and that we can leave them there, trusting that the situation will be cared for as God sees fit.

As we view the problems in the world, prayer helps us to imitate the sacrificial love and compassion of Jesus to find long-lasting, faithful and humanly dignified solutions to our nation's problems. On every occasion racism, sexism, bigotry, violence and greed are sinful. This is the Gospel.

The solutions must be in the six themes of Luke's Gospel for which we pray.

#### Silent Reflection after the Readings

We are generally following the recommendation of the Church to pause in silence—we suggest 30 seconds. Daniel McCarthy, a Benedictine Monk teaching liturgy in Belgium recently wrote that Jesus paused when he read in the Nazareth synagogue from the scroll of the book of Isaiah (Luke 4:21). When he had finished, "he rolled up the scroll, gave it back to the attendant and sat down. The eyes of all were fixed on him. Then he began to speak." There was a pregnant pause before Christ started to speak, just as we need a moment to reflect.

#### Pope Francis Visited Asylum Seekers after deaths at sea

On July 8, Pope Francis made his first journey outside Rome to Lampedusa, an Italian island off Sicily where 11,000 refugees from north Africa are held. After hearing that 10 refugees perished on 17 June after their boat sank, he said, "I felt that I had to come here today to pray to offer a gesture of closeness, but also to awaken our conscience so that such a thing never happens again... "those brothers and sisters of ours were trying to get out of difficult situations and find a bit of serenity and peace; they were searching for a better place for themselves and their families, but they found death." The Pope lamented. "We have lost the sense of fraternal responsibility... we've grown used to others' suffering—it has nothing to do with us, we are not interested, it is not our business," he exclaimed. He threw a floral wreath into the water as a tribute to the estimated 20,000 refugees who have died at sea in the last 20 years.

#### 50 Years Ago Pope John XX taught us how to die

Pope John's secretary recalled recently the Pope's final days in June 1963 as he lay dying of cancer." I didn't see a single sign of depression, a single tear in his eyes. There was no fear; he was completely serene. In fact, he asked one cardinal who was weeping: "Why are you crying? We (meaning I) have done our duty, we have served; it is time to leave—calmly, blessing, loving and forgiving."

#### More Pokies for Sunbury- above the Melbourne average



#### Prayer for Vocations.


May the Holy Spirit guide the Church during the Year of Faith so that all Catholics may experience a deepened renewal of faith, hope and love.
