THE NARROW DOOR

Way back, before the anti-discrimination laws, Mrs Rosenberg stood in front of the receptionist at a fashionable hotel wanting to book in for the night. The clerk looked down at his book and said, 'Sorry, lady, the hotel is full.' Mrs Rosenberg replied 'But your sign says that you have vacancies.' The clerk fidgeted nervously and said, 'Lady, you know we don't admit Jews. Try the other side of town.' Mrs Rosenberg stiffened. 'I'll have you know I am a Christian convert.' 'Oh yes? Let me quiz you. How was Jesus born?' 'Jesus was born to a virgin called Mary in a little town called Bethlehem.' 'Very good, tell me more.' 'He was born in a stable in a manger.' 'That's right. And why was he born in a stable?' '...because some idiot behind a hotel desk wouldn't give a Jewish lady a room for the night! ... any more guestions?'

When we appear before Peter at the gates of heaven we will not be questioned as to our religion, or race or colour. Being well-connected or belonging to the Catholic Club is not as important as being a good person. Salvation is on offer to every human being on the face of the earth. There is no free entry for ticket holders. On the contrary, we need to try our best to enter by the 'narrow door'. The 'narrow door' is a metaphor for effort and struggle. There is no automatic entry. Name-dropping and badge-waving cut no ice with God. It is not enough to say we have shared a meal with Jesus in the Eucharist on the odd occasion. It is not enough to say we have heard Christ preaching in the proclamation of the Gospel once in a while. We must live out the Gospel. We must 'walk the walk' and not just 'talk the talk'.

At the beginning of today's Gospel we are reminded that Jesus is 'walking the walk'. He is on the road to Jerusalem. He is not just walking. He is actively preaching and healing as he goes. Though he is looking ahead, he is not blind to the needs of those around him. He is single-minded in his journey and there's no stopping him. His only stoppages are to preach the word and to do works of mercy.

The questions of 'who will be saved' and 'how many' are curiosities and irrelevant. They display a shallow mind. They are a distraction. A better question would have been, 'what must I do to be saved?' The answer to the latter question, the real **question**, is to be single-minded in our efforts. It is to have a purpose in life. Jesus walked the journey to Jerusalem with purposeful steps. We are told 'he set his face resolutely towards Jerusalem.' With chin forward and face set like flint, there was purposeful determination in every action he took and every word he spoke.

A committed Christian lives a life of single-minded commitment. It involves a disciplined life, clear priorities and clarity of vision, knowing where to get help, being aware of dangers and pitfalls, off-loading unnecessary baggage, not wasting energy on useless pursuits, and seizing opportunities for doing good. This is what Jesus means when he speaks of the 'narrow door'. Anyone can hit a big target, but to hit the bull's eye that requires effort and skill. The old understanding of sin was: 'to miss the target'. Our target is to lead a virtuous life, a life built on gospel values.

THE FUTURE OF CATHOLIC EDUCATION IN OUR GROWING PARISH: has been discussed over the last two years at our Parish Education Board and Salesian College Council. The Principals and Curriculum leaders of our three schools in Sunbury are taking part in a program over six weeks looking at the future of education at primary and secondary levels. Our Board has been assisted by the Director of Planning of Catholic Education Melbourne. Salesian College Council has engaged Craig Brown, an architect experienced in developing master plans for schools. A draft master plan is being developed with input from staff.

During our three hour meeting of Salesian College Council last Thursday evening, we heard that the new Year 9 campus is being built and proceeding on time and on budget. The student leaders told us that Australian Catholic University is the most popular choice among students doing VCE.
