Advent 'O Antiphons'

I am reading a book entitled 'Who is Jesus?' The question we should ask ourselves this time of the year is: Who is this Jesus whose birth we celebrate at Christmas? Another question worth asking is: What does the Church in its liturgy proclaim Jesus to be? From the 17th of December to the 24th the Church uses seven 'O Antiphons' to tell us what we should believe about the One whose birth we celebrate on the 25th of December.

An antiphon is a song, prayer or part psalm chanted in responsorial fashion. The 'O Antiphons' of Advent are proclaimed in the seven days leading up to Christmas Eve. During the Advent season, the closer we get to the great feast of Christmas, the more the liturgy accentuates the call to the Saviour to 'Come'. During the praying of Vespers in the week before Christmas, priests, religious and some lay people who pray the Office, proclaim an 'O Antiphon' before and after the Magnificat.

The **seven O Antiphons** of Advent summarize the hopes of the people of the Old Testament who waited for the coming of the Messiah. They also summarize our desire for Christ to come into our hearts.

O come, thou Wisdom	Christ comes as personified Wisdom. Christ is the divine wisdom, the Word made flesh . 'In the beginning was the Word (Logos), and the Word was with God, and the Word was God.' Jn 1:1		
O come. thou Lord of Might	Christ comes as the powerful One of God, who showed his mighty power in the history of the Chosen people, especially in the great story of liberation, the <i>Exodus</i> . Christ comes with divine power to save his people from sin and endless death.		
O come, thou Flower of Jesse's Stem	Christ is the full blossoming of the Jesse family tree. Jesse was the father of King David and Jesus is the promised One who fulfils God's promise to David that his kingdom will have no end. 'The Lord God will give him the throne of his ancestor David. He will reign over the house of Jacob forever.' Lk 1:32-33		
O come, thou Key of David	He who holds the key holds power. The key is a symbol of authority. 'All authority in heaven and on earth has been given to me.' Mt 28:18 Christ holds the key to the kingdom of heaven. In turn, Christ, as head of the Church, has entrusted his power and authority to Peter, his vicar, and to Peter's successors. 'To you I will give the keys of the kingdom of heaven' Mt 16:19		
O come, thou Dayspring	Christ is the 'Radiant Dawn', the daybreak from on high, bringing in a new day. Christ is the 'Light of the world', bringing an end to the darkness of sin and evil. Christ is the 'sun of righteousness'. What the sun does in the sphere of nature, Christ does in the spiritual sphere, emitting rays of holiness and grace.		
O come thou Desire of the Na- tions	Christ is universal king, bringing salvation to all nations. He sends his apostles to the ends of the earth. 'Go, therefore, make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father, and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit.' Mt 28:19		
O come, Emmanuel	'Emmanuel' is a name applied to Jesus by Matthew. Mt 1:23. He tells us it means God-with-us. In Christ, God makes his home in us. 'Behold, I am with you always, until the end of time.' Mt 28:20		

Those who sing the seven verses of the hymn, 'O come Emmanuel' are inviting Christ who is all the above to come into our world. Those who go to daily Mass in the last seven days of Advent will come across the seven O Antiphons in the Gospel acclamations. Let us make room for Christ to come into our hearts this Christmas. Live, Jesus, in our hearts forever.
