Feast of the Holy Family of Jesus, Mary & Joseph

We have much to be thankful for this Christmas. Those who have experienced the joy of the birth of a baby into a family understand the true happiness of the event—it is a life changing moment when a child is born. A husband/ man becomes a Dad and a wife/ woman becomes a mother. Their whole purpose becomes that of protecting and providing for their child. Life still goes on but the importance changes to the wellbeing of their child and family.

Can you imagine the fear that would come from the threat of your child being killed? Herod had placed an order to kill young male babies aged 2 years and under at the time of the birth of Jesus. What would you have done? I believe anything you could to protect your family and child. There is nothing a parent wouldn't do to save their child from harm. Joseph and Mary did the only thing they could to save baby Jesus from Herods evil plan. They fled as refugees to Egypt. Not unlike those fleeing Syria and other homelands under threat. They would not have had the feasts we enjoyed this year, or had the Christmas lights on. Some probably had no more than the love in their hearts to give their children this Christmas. But isn't that what we should give? The love in our hearts to those around us. Our families and neighbours and even those we don't know.... Give them a smile even! A kind word! You don't need to give them gold, just a smile, kindness. Makes the world better all because of baby Jesus being born in a manger. We also give thanks for the celebration of Pope Francis' first Christmas. Part of his humble and peaceful message for Christmas was prompted by a banner in St Peter's Square that read, "The poor cannot wait!" Pope Francis spoke of the great difficulties that families without fixed dwelling face- not unlike the Holy Family, to whom the Lord Jesus was born in a barn, and that experienced forced flight from their native land into Egypt. "Family and home go together," said Pope Francis. He went on to say, "I call on everyone: individuals, organs of society, authorities, to do everything possible to assure that every family has a place to live."

The Feast of the Holy Family today means we celebrate Mary, Joseph and Jesus, but also our own families and our universal family—the Church. The Church is the church because we are all part of it—like a family. Church is not about coming to Mass every week then forgetting about those we just celebrated with. Church is an extension of our own families. Please remember those around you today are sharing in your joy today with the Feast of the Holy Family. And as all families do, they share in the good times and the sad times throughout life. Our Church community supports each other in this way.

Marriage- makes a difference for Children

"Couples should not have children if their relationship is not stable enough to merit getting married," Sir Paul Coleridge, a High Court Judge speaking early this month after 40 years of messy court business with separated couples.

Sir Paul has retired from the High Court to establish the Marriage Foundation in the UK to promote relationship education and to promote better public understanding of the nature and benefit of marriage. He quotes the research by the Foundation that suggests children with unmarried parents were twice as likely to suffer a family break up as those with married parents.

The Judge was quoted by Bettina Arndt the Melbourne social commentator in the "Age" on 16 December, Arndt quotes Australian research based on the Longitudinal Study of Australian Children which found young families with cohabiting families were nearly three times more likely to break up than married families. The same researchers, Lixia Qu and Ruth Weston, found children in cohabiting families lag behind children with married parents in over all socio economical and general development as in learning and with behaviorural problems.

The Brookings Institution in Washington suggested that the answer may lie in decision making process. Most people marry after a process of discovering mutual commitment to long term goals. That is lacking in cohabiting couples who general drift into living together.

Hence, marriage is more than a piece of paper. Some marriages do break down and those involved need our compassionate care and professional therapy as such breakdowns are traumatic.
