AUSTRALIA DAY

In 1911, among the first to promote Australia Day, replacing Empire Day, was Cardinal Moran of Sydney.

"Each Australia Day invites us to reflect upon how well we are living our shared national values," Bishop Holohan, Bunbury. Back in 2011, the-then Bishop of Rockhampton, Bishop Brian Heenan, gave a homily that captured the mood of the country, immediately after the formal apology to the Stolen Generation, by then Prime Minister, Kevin Rudd.

_"tt is significant that this year Australian of the Year should be Professor Mick Dodson – sometimes called the 'Father of Reconciliation'. We know...many Indigenous Australians believe there is nothing to celebrate on this foundation day which they see as Invasion Day. Other Indigenous people see the day as an opportunity to begin a new relationship of respect.

'We respect both points of view and to those Indigenous people here this morning, I extend to you a most sincere welcome, a welcome that you extend to all non-Indigenous people, for your people were here long before we or our forebears came to this land. As I have said before, may I say again as bishop that I am sorry for what happened and offer an unreserved apology for the injuries you suffered.

"We are disciples of Jesus but also citizens of our world and not living in a Christian ghetto. We are the people of this land Australia and called to work together, with all our differences to live out our humanity with respect for all."

CARITAS AT WORK AFTER PHILIPPINES TYPHOON

Jim Murphy, a British Parliamentarian, last month visited Talacloban City where 5000 lives were lost. "The dedication and determination of the young aid workers I met was striking, living out in the field and sleeping by night in the very evacuation centres they help staff by day." Our Church is providing moral, spiritual and material support. "At the centre of terribly damaged communities, faith is holding neighbourhoods together.... The Church is such a rock for those left behind.

"One clear fact stands out from my visit to the Philippines. Aid works, aid saves lives, it protects the vulnerable and gets communities back on their feet." Our parishioners gave \$2957.00 to Caritas appeal for the victims of the typhoon in November.

HOMELESSNESS- NO ROOM AT THE INN

DePaul International is a group of charities inspired by the vision and practice of St Vincent de Paul, an innovator in his day and one of the most significant figures in the history of Christian response to need.

DePaul International works in Ukraine, Slovakia, France, UK, USA and Ireland. The organization has found on the global level, homelessness is often invisible, subsumed into the wider debate about poverty. The group is beginning a new approach. "Housing First" where the priority is to give homeless their own home and then work on other problems. This requires a significant provision of social housing.

NO WEEKDAY MASS DURING HEATWAVES

Our life is a gift from God. Hence, we are not to take unnecessary risks with our health and life. Health experts like Professor Neville Nichols of Monash University predicted an increase in deaths during last week's heat wave. Unfortunately his prediction became reality when 180 people died due to the heat, including a local man and a husband and wife from a former parish of mine. As reported in the media, Ambulance Victoria had 2500 call outs on each of those four days. Following a discussion with some Mass goers last Tuesday evening and in the light of advice from health experts, weekday Mass will not be celebrated when the temperature is forecast to be 35C or more.

THE END OF MASS

In the Instruction on how to celebrate Mass approved by Pope John Paul II in 2002, the celebration is to end with the Dismissal: "Go, the Mass is ended and proclaim the Good News." There is no direction to sing a recessional hymn. Our Mass finishes with the Blessing and Dismissal. Then it is time to greet one another, to be a communitarian person, relating to others around us with whom we have praised God and been fed with God's Word and Sacrament.

CHRISTMAS MASSES REVIEW

The Liturgy Planning Team met last Wednesday to review Advent and Christmas and to plan Lent.

Firstly, the Mass at Rupertswood Stadium requires immense amount of moving chairs (1650) and gathering liturgical items from both our churches. So to those who came on Friday 20 December at 3pm and 6pm, our thanks we give. However putting the chairs away at 8pm on the night was left to too few volunteers. The dismantling of the altar and removal of liturgical equipment was also done by only a few. Staging the Mass at the Stadium requires the installation of audio visual equipment with its 3kms of electrical cabling. The sound and vision were very good , costing us \$1650.

The Festival of Carols and Readings on 22 December was very well received and will be repeated this year.

REFUGEE POLICY A 'CAMPAIGN OF CRUELTY': BISHOP SAUNDERS:

The Australian government is in effect conducting a campaign of cruelty towards asylum seekers, the Chairman of the Australian Catholic Social Justice Council, Bishop Christopher Saunders, said on 23 January 2014 'The government's campaign, like that of its predecessors, has only one purpose: to deter desperate men, women and children from seeking protection from persecution and danger', Bishop Saunders said

'The government claims that it is fighting a war', Bishop Saunders said. 'If it is a war, then it is being fought against wretched and defenceless people.'

We are ignoring the most important issue: the millions of people in our region and around the world who need protection and security.

'The only hope for a solution to the refugee problem is international cooperation', Bishop Saunders said.

'Australia's policies are undermining and destroying that hope by angering the very nations we need to work with.

'It seems that friendly relationships with our neighbours are becoming collateral damage in pursuit of an aggressive and callous policy', Bishop Saunders continued. 'Can we be surprised if Indonesia is offended when Australian naval ships stray into its waters, or when we ignore its protests and force boats to turn back to their sovereign territory?'

Bishop Saunders quoted recent words of Pope Francis, who said: 'Migrants and refugees are not pawns on the chessboard of humanity'. The Pope called for us all to move away from 'attitudes of defensiveness and fear'.
