#### Presentation of the Lord

Having seen Jesus begin his public ministry with his call for repentance, his announcement that the kingdom of God is at hand, and the calling to discipleship of the first four of his apostles - his witnesses - today we take a step back, as if opening a photo album, to an incident in his childhood. We only do this when February 2 falls on a Sunday so let's look carefully at the picture, because it will be a while before we see it again.

Malachi is the last of the prophets of the Hebrew Scriptures. Despite the unending history of failure on the part of God's people to live as God's children, which runs through the whole of the Hebrew Scriptures, Malachi 's 'last word' is one of hope, based not on Israel's ability to change its ways but entirely on God's faithfulness. God will send his messenger and redeemer, but he will come unexpectedly and he will 'refine', that is 'purify', his people as metal is purified in a furnace or as cloth is cleaned in lime: this will not be a pleasant process but it will result in something wonderful.

The letter to the Hebrews takes up its fundamental theme - that God truly loves his people, and to truly love is to truly share in the joys and hopes, griefs and fears of those who are truly loved.

Luke shows us Mary and Joseph bringing Jesus to the Temple in Jerusalem as the Law of Moses requires, forty days after his birth. He makes no mention of Herod or the flight into Egypt. Luke, himself a Greek and occasionally not as precise about the exact requirements of the Law as Matthew, Mark or Paul, says that it was time for 'their purification'. In fact it was the prescribed time for Mary's 'purification' and for Jesus' 'redemption'. What is that all about?

The Mosaic Law says that a woman is 'ritually unclean' - this has nothing to do with physical cleanliness or otherwise - for forty days after childbirth. [Lv 12:1-8] That sounds very harsh and even abusive to us. In fact, from the woman's perspective it meant that she was exempt from all the requirements of the Law and from all community obligations during that period. ...

In the case of Jesus, he was the first-born son, he was, ritually speaking, the father of the next generation and so, according to the Law [Nb 3:40-51], he did not belong to his parents but, because every generation of this People belonged to God, so the first-born son 'in whom' the next generation 'resides', belongs to God. We see this in the story of Samuel and his mother Hannah. Hannah promises to dedicate her son to God, and when he is weaned she brings him to Eli the priest at Shiloh and leaves him there to serve at the Temple. Joseph is responsible for providing the symbolic sacrifices which enable his wife's return to full participation in the life of the community and Jesus' 'redemption' from a state of 'separation' from the ordinary people to being 'included' among them. This is a powerful image of the Incarnation.

Simeon's beautiful prayer, which has formed the basis of the Church's Night Prayer since the fifth century, is one we should all know by heart and say each night. He recognises the Messiah in this little child and is filled with joy. May we do the same. ... Richard Hallett

NO WEEKDAY MASS DURING HEATWAVES: Our life is a gift from God. Hence, we are not to take unnecessary risks with our health. Health experts like Professor Neville Nichols of Monash University predicted an increase in deaths during the heat wave. Unfortunately his prediction became reality when 180 people died dut to the heat, including a husband and wife from a former parish of mine. As reported in the media, Ambulance Victoria had 2500 call outs on each of those four days. In the light of advice from health experts, weekday Mass will not be celebrated when the temperature is forecast to be 35C or more.

**OUR PRAYERFUL SYMPATHY:** we offer to the family of Owen Jeffs who entered eternal life last Sunday aged 81 years after only one day in hospital. Owen and Beverley his wife of 61 years who proceeded him into eternal life two years ago came to our parish twenty years ago. They have seven children: Neil, Graeme, Robyn, Lynne, Shane, Gail and Jennifer– many of them living in Sunbury. Owen's funeral was held on Friday afternoon.

We also offer our sympathy to Lydia Chiodo whose husband Angelo died suddenly following the heat wave on 18 January. His funeral has not yet been held as the Coroner's Office has not completed its enquiry due to the large number of deaths from the heat wave.

**LIVING THE JOY OF THE GOSPEL:** in Pope Francis's exhortation Evangelii Gaudium, he talks of 'joy' as a requirement for evangelization, and how 'personal dialogue' is needed for any authentic invitation into the faith.
