#### **5TH SUNDAY OF LENT**

As we draw towards the end of our Lenten preparation for the celebration of the death and resurrection of Jesus, we hear three readings today which encapsulate and bring to completion the scriptural account of God's creative and saving action in individual people, in communities and in the world as a whole.

Ezekiel, who, when Gods people were in despairing exile in Babylon, assembled the great majority of the books of the Old Testament, encapsulates the whole of his teaching and that of the Scriptures, in his dramatic vision of the valley of dead bones. God breathes God's own spirit into them and they are restored to life, to a life much greater than they had before. Paul's letter to the Romans is the masterpiece of his exposition of the Christian experience, and this experience is contained in the words we read today: 'If the spirit of him who raised Jesus from the dead is living in you, then he who raised Jesus from the dead will give life to your mortal bodies through his spirit living in

Restoring Lazarus to life is the ultimate 'sign' of Jesus' mission and the ultimate confirmation that God is working in and through him to transform and to give new and abundant life - even when this seems impossible.

As I write this and as you read it, several thousand asylum seekers, the great majority of whom are fleeing situations which would terrify us, are imprisoned in our name by our government in conditions which are a violation of their dignity as our brothers and sisters and as children of the living God. Next Sunday - Palm Sunday - you and I are being called by our bishops to attend a prayer service in solidarity with refugees and asylum seekers at 1.00pm at St. Patrick's Cathedral. This time of prayer and of witness to the injustice being done to these most vulnerable women, men and children, will be led by Bishop Vincent Long, himself an asylum seeker and refugee who came here by boat.

As Christians each one of us has a fundamental responsibility to speak up for, and to work for justice. Silence and inaction in the face of such blatant cruelty is a denial of our faith in the one who came to give each one of us, particularly the most vulnerable, the gift of a new and abundant life. Make every effort to come to the Palm Sunday prayer service next Sunday, remembering Jesus' words,. 'Whatever you did, or failed to do, to the least of these brothers and sisters of mine, you did, or failed to do, to me.' (Matthew 25:31-46- this is the end of Jesus' teaching)

PROJECT COMPASSION REFLECTION: In this Sunday's Gospel we meet Lazarus and his two sisters, Martha and Mary. They were friends of Jesus, always making him welcome in their home. The death of Lazarus in today's story moved Jesus to tears— and it brought forth Martha's acknowledgment of her faith in the power of Jesus. "if you had been here, he would not have died." Jesus went to the tomb and called, "Lazarus, come forth!" The dead man responded, stumbling out of the vault, still wrapped in his funeral sheet.

We stand in awe at the power of Jesus to restore the dead to life. Jesus commissions us to follow his example, to bring life to others, through the power of the Holy Spirit vested in us. *Project Compassion boxes can be collected from the gathering space of St Anne's church.*
