Liturgy

In the Sermon on the Mount Jesus outlines the Christian way. The Great Sermon is the *Magna Carta*, the blueprint of Christian spirituality. His instruction concerning *prayer*, has this to say. 'And whenever you pray, don't be like the hypocrites; for they love to stand and pray in the synagogues and at the street corners, so that they may be seen by others. Truly I tell you, they have received their reward. But when you pray, go into your room and shut the door and pray to your Father who is in secret; and your Father who sees in secret will reward you.' (Mt 6:5-6)

This instruction by Jesus must be understood in its proper context. Our religious behaviour must never be ostentatious. Almsgiving, fasting and prayers must never be done to attract attention to ourselves to win people's praise and admiration. Concerning prayer, Jesus is not saying we should refrain from public worship: he is alerting us to the danger of wrong motives.

While it is good for me to pray in private and develop a personal relationship with my God, it is equally good for me to remember that I belong to God's family, the people of God. It is good for me to join in prayer with others who share my faith. In public worship I get a sense of belonging and a feeling that I am not alone. There is support out there for me; and I can support others by my presence and participation. There is a time to pray alone and a time to pray, sing and worship with my fellow Christians. There is a time and place for every purpose under heaven.

The word 'liturgy' is derived from the Greek 'leiturgia' meaning literally 'the work of the people'. During the Easter Vigil this truth, viz 'that liturgy is the work of the people' struck me forcefully. Yes, I was the priest out front leading the ritual, but I was conscious of the back-up work of many others. The secretary and the liturgy team had been heavily involved in the planning stage. The paschal candle had been specially chosen and purchased; so had all those individual non-drip candles. Someone had put their hand up to prepare the paschal fire. The musicians had spent much time in preparation and practice. The coordinator of the altar servers had done likewise, preparing them for service. Lectors, collectors, special ministers of Holy Communion...all did their part. The priest did his part, but he was mindful that many others had made – and were making - their contribution.

Week in and week out we come together in public worship. Even the least of us plays his or her part. Time is set aside specifically for Church. Other things are put on hold. We come to contribute to the assembly by our presence and active participation. We arrive at Church and everything is ready to proceed. A good number do that little bit extra as ministers of one kind or another. Someone opens up the Church and sets up for Mass, then stays behind to lock up. We should never take each others' contribution to liturgy for granted. Liturgy is a team effort. We, individually, left to ourselves, would be the poorer.
