#### **Trinity Sunday**

It was not until the first Ecumenical Council in the year 325, consisting of 318 bishops from all parts of the then Christian world, meeting in the city of Nicaea, near modern Istanbul in Turkey, that the formal teaching of the Church about the Triune nature of God started to take shape.

The Old Testament, the Hebrew Scriptures, taught what God was like – that God constantly loved and rescued his people, despite their rejection and half-heartedness in keeping the Law which had been given to them. That God was creator of all, all powerful, glorious beyond measure, and that he had chosen a people to be his own. After the Resurrection, the disciples came to recognize that whatever could be said about God as revealed in the (Hebrew) Scriptures could be said about Jesus. St. John reflects this in his Gospel: 'The Father and I are one.' The same life that the Father had, Jesus also had. In a similar way they came to recognize that the Holy Spirit had this same life and dwelt within them, and they in the Spirit, enabling them to live lives of joy, fulfillment and loving service.

What is so important about this for us? That God is not 'solitary', 'separate' or 'remote' but it is God's very nature to be in constant and boundlessly loving interpersonal relationship with all of God's creation. And, as the Book of Genesis recounts right at the beginning, that we are made in God's image, that this image in us is destroyed by sin, and as St Paul says, is restored by Christ in Baptism.

It is very appropriate then, that this feast follows immediately after Pentecost, when we recalled the beginnings of the Christian community, the Church. It forcibly reminds us that we are made, and constantly called by God, to be in an ever developing and deepening relationship with God and with each other, and that this is brought about in and by the power of the Holy Spirit, who is God.

**Renewing our Parish community:** Having come to the end of the Easter season, we now enter what is curiously called 'Ordinary Time', not because it is unimportant but simply because the weeks are numbered in order. Indeed it is a long time of prayer, reflection and growth, symbolised by the colour green and extending to Advent at the beginning of December.

Just as the Church's teaching on the Trinity took several centuries to mature after the thoughtful and often laborious efforts of many great leaders and teachers, so a similar ongoing responsibility falls to each one of us to work positively, as Pope Francis is reminding us, to bring the joy of the Gospel to life in the lives and hearts of those with whom we live, particularly for those in need of any kind. Next weekend we will all be invited to renew our commitment to our mission as disciples of Jesus by taking an active part in one of the many groups within our parish. In accordance with the decision of our Parish Assembly last September, we will soon begin having a Parish Meeting Night each month on which, wherever possible, our parish groups will hold their meetings, having prayed together at the start and sharing supper afterwards. This will enable us all to share more fully in, and have a much richer experience of that common life which we share from the Father through his Son in his Spirit.
