Special Collection this weekend Peter's Pence Annual Collection for the Holy Father's Humanitarian Relief

This coming Wednesday, 16 July, is the official feast day of Our Lady of Mount Carmel and ten days later is the feast of Mary's parents, Joachim and Anne. Because the festivals of both our parish patrons occur so close together we will celebrate our parish festival next weekend. Also on Wednesday all members of all our parish groups are invited to come to our first Parish Meeting Night at St. Anne's School, beginning with prayer together at 7.30. Each group will then hold its meeting for an hour within the school buildings, followed by supper toaether.

Our parish festival and meeting night are very much in keeping with the 800 year old family oriented traditions of the communities of Saint Mary of Mt. Carmel and the extended family of Jesus. There are two fundamental principles at work in these traditions:

First, the genuine recognition that we are all brothers and sisters in one extended family. Being a member of a family brings us rights and responsibilities. We can rightfully expect that all our family members will show interest in us, be aware of us and of what is happening in our lives, care for us, provide friendship and practical support, rejoice with us in our good times, sustain and comfort us in our sorrows. For this to be a reality, and not mere words or a pious ideal, each of us has the responsibility to take an active part in the life of the family. At one level, this simply means 'turning up' for family gatherings, and making simply 'turning up' a priority when choosing how we spend our time. At a deeper level it means bringing our giftedness, wisdom, skills, compassion, material resources, to the support of our brothers and sisters. This sounds obvious and self-evident, but it is certainly not easy. It is precisely the willingness to forego our own independent freedom of choice [sacrifice] in order to participate in the common family life which Saint Paul presents to us as the foundation stone of the Gospel of the Christ. It is precisely this that Eucharist re-presents [makes present again] for us, and it is precisely by participating in the common [communion] family life that we emerge into that greater peace, freedom and fullness of life which Jesus proclaims – this is the establishment, here and now, of God's kingdom. Of course we can always choose not to participate, just to live loosely on the margins, while retaining our individual freedom. We all know of family situations in which this occurs, but ultimately this is not life-giving either to us or to our family.

Second, by the way we actively participate in the life of this extended family, to provide a practical demonstration and invitation to others of the reality of God's loving participation in the life of each person, of all human history and of all creation. This responsibility is called 'prophetic witness'. Life only comes to fullness in us to the extent that we give it away to others. We see this powerfully expressed in today's reading from Isaiah – God's word is always powerful and fruitful. Paul reminds us that the joy and freedom which we experience as people who are 'in Christ', even in the midst of difficulties and suffering, are to extend to the whole of creation which is in the process of 'giving birth' to 'eternal' [fullness of divine] life. As he sits in the boat Jesus sets out the difficulties, the apparent uncertainty but ultimate and abundant fruitfulness, of the lifegiving task of his disciples: 'Imagine that you are a sower going out to sow . . . '

PRIESTS' ASSOCIATION ENDORSED AUSTRALIAN BISHOPS ON ASY-LUM SEEKERS: Our bishops put out a statement on 8 May 2014 speaking to the entire Australian community urging respect for the rights of asylum seekers. The bishops questioned is there an underlying attitude of racism and also of the selfishness of the rich. The bishops call on parliamentarians of all parties to turn away from harsh policies to the path of a realistic compassion that deals with both human need and electoral pressure. They "call on the nation as a whole to say no to the dark forces which make these policies possible. The time has come to examine our conscience and then to act differently". The Australian Council of Priests endorsed the bishops' statement on 14 May 2014.

TWO PEACEMAKER POPES—JOHN XXIII AND FRANCIS: Both have stepped over the barriers of ideology or religion to evoke bonds of a common humanity committed to promoting the wellbeing of all people, especially the poor and marginalized.

John XXIII was a stretcher bearer in the First World War and saw first hand the carnage of war and human suffering. In April 1963, he published his encyclical "Peace on Earth" (Pacem in Terris) in which he called for dialogue between different political systems to lessen the chance of another frightful war.

Pope Francis is seeking a similar path as capitalism struggles to manage gross inequalities in living standards. He used to visit the poor areas in Buenos Aires. (full text—"Eureka Street" 23 April 2014).

Inequality is present in our own country. The Business Review Weekly states the top seven richest Australians own \$56 billion while 4,500,000 Australians at the other end, own \$54 billion. (Australian Bureau of Statistics).

POPE FRANCIS: "I HAVEN'T DONE ANYTHING ON MY OWN": On 30th June, in an interview with Italian daily "Il Messaggero", the Pope was asked what was his plan. He replied "The plan I follow is what the Cardinals have requested during the General Congregations before the Conclave (March 2013) My decisions are the fruit of the pre Conclave meetings. I haven't done anything on my own" (English translation by Zenit 2 July 2014).
