YEAR C - THE YEAR OF LUKE

Welcome to the Year of Luke's Gospel. Most Sundays of 2016 we will hear the priest say, 'A reading from the Holy Gospel according to Luke.' The gospels of Matthew (Year A), Mark (Year B) and Luke (Year C) are called Synoptic Gospels because they see eye-to-eye and have much in common. But they vary in length: Matthew (28 chapters); Mark (16 chapters); Luke (24 chapters). They also vary in narrative, material and style. Luke, in particular, is unique in what he offers the reader.

To Luke we Christians owe thanks for the stories featuring Mary the Mother of Jesus. We have the following narratives:

The story of the annunciation, where the angel tells Mary that she has been chosen by God to be the mother of his Son,

The story of the visitation, where Mary visits Elizabeth and praises God in the 'Magnificat'

The story of the angels appearing to the shepherds in the fields at the birth of Jesus,

The story of Jesus at the age of 12 being lost and found in the temple.

In all these stories Mary plays a prominent part. Luke also provides us with many other stories and parables found only in his gospel.

The raising of the widow's son at Nain (7:11-17)

John the Baptist still wondering if Jesus is the one who is to come (7:18-23) The story of Simon the Pharisee who is shocked by Jesus' allowing the sinful woman to touch him, anointing him, pouring tears over his feet, kissing them and wiping them with her hair (7:36-50)

The story of the Good Samaritan (10: 25-37) The story of Martha and Mary (10:38-42

The parables of the lost sheep, the lost coin and the prodigal son (chapter 15)

The parable of the cunning steward (16:1-9)

The parable of the rich man and the poor man, Lazarus (16: 19-31)

The story of ten lepers, only one of whom (a Samaritan) returned to thank Jesus for his cure (17: 11-19)

The story of the boastful Pharisee and the humble tax collector (18:9-14)

The story of Zacchaeus (19:1-10)

The list could go on and on...into the passion narrative and into the resurrection stories, the highlight of which is the story of the Emmaus journey of two despondent and dejected disciples (24:13-35). To them Jesus reveals God's plan of salvation.

One feature of Luke' gospel is the number of times we see Jesus at table enjoying a meal in a social setting. It is interesting to note that the two disciples on the way to Emmaus failed to recognise Jesus until they sat down at table with him. We are told they recognised him at the breaking of the bread. Robert Karris has written a book, which I hope to purchase. The title of the book is: 'Eating Your Way through the Gospel of Luke'. Brendan Byrne SJ is the author of another book that highlights Jesus enjoying table fellowship. The title of his book is: 'The Hospitality of God'. For those interested in understanding the Gospel of Luke, I am toying with the idea of offering a series of talks on Luke later in the year. Each Sunday this year we will be served a 'snippet' from Luke's gospel. Robert Karris suggests that unless we understand Luke's gospel as a whole and have a feel where Luke is taking us, we will fall into 'snippetitis'. To me that sounds like a disease to be avoided at all cost.
