#### **UNDERSTANDING SIN**

Sin is a problem in our society today. Rather, the problem is that people are not aware that sin is part of their DNA. Over the last fifty years people have gradually become desensitised to sin in their lives. Their consciences have become numb and dull. More than fifty years ago Pope Pius XII said that the greatest sin of our age is the lack or loss of the sense of sin. It explains why less than 1% of Catholics frequent the sacrament of reconciliation. They have nothing to confess: so they think.

On the surface level of conscience sin is understood as the person having done something morally wrong or failing to do the right thing. These transgressions or omissions can be given specific names such as lies, theft, impatience, disobedience, or missing Mass. Not only can they be named but they can also be numbered. These named and counted sins are like bad fruit on a tree. We can pick them out, confess them, and get rid of them. Then we get on with life and they reappear again and again. Confession does not solve the problem. The Lenten call to repentance is a call to look at eradicating the problem by examining the root causes.

There is a traditional list of seven poisonous roots usually called the **Seven Capital Sins** which are causing the rot: pride, covetousness (greed), lust, envy, anger, gluttony, sloth (laziness). Every act of sin, every piece of bad fruit, can be traced back to its root source. The financial troubles of the world and the drug epidemic ruining the lives of the young can be traced back to covetousness (greed for money). The rich want to get richer. Enough is not enough. The rapes, the infidelity to one's spouse, sexual abuse...can be traced back to lust. Impatience and the loss of temper have their root source in anger. We can be rightfully angry; but how do we channel that righteous anger is another question. The alcohol problem of our society, the binge drinking, the violence that is the result of drunkenness, can all be traced back to their root source, gluttony. The shirking of one's duty, offloading onto others most of our responsibilities, not pulling our weight... all have their root source in sloth or laziness.

However, there is a deeper level of conscience which needs examination. How close am I to my God? What is my relationship to God? When Isaiah and Peter received a personal experience of God they were overwhelmed by the sense of their unworthiness, their sinfulness. 'What a wretched state I am in! I am lost, for I am a man of unclean lips and live among a people of unclean lips, and my eyes have looked at the King, the Lord of hosts.' (Isaiah 6:5) 'Leave me, Lord, I am a sinful man.' (Luke 5:8) A mature conscience makes one acutely sensitive to one's unworthiness in the sight of the All Holy God. Having been loved by God so much one has a sense of not having adequately responded to that love. It explains why saints have wept for their sinfulness even though they were not guilty of what we call outright sins. St Francis wept because 'LOVE is not loved.' In the light of the saint's intimate relationship with God, to say 'I am a sinner' is deeper than to say 'I have sinned.'

Lent is on the horizon. Ash Wednesday is only three days away. In this **Year of Mercy** this should be a record year for our parish to experience the mercy of God by approaching the sacrament of reconciliation, either through individual confession or as part of a communal gathering in the second rite of reconciliation. Lent is a good time for us to repair our relationship with God and the people in our lives.

#### Lent 2016

The Lenten season has a twofold character:

- It recalls baptism or prepares for it
- It stresses a penitential spirit

By these means especially, Lent readies the faithful for celebrating the paschal mystery after a period of closer attention to the Word of God, and more ardent prayer. In the liturgy itself and in the liturgy centred instructions, these baptismal and penitential themes should be more pronounced.

Hence,

- Wider use is to be made of baptismal features proper to the Lenten liturgy
- The same approach holds for the penitential elements

During Lent, penance should not be only internal and individual but also external and social...

In any event, let the paschal fast be kept sacred. It should be observed everywhere on Good Friday and, where possible prolonged throughout Holy Saturday, so that the joys of the Sunday of the resurrection may be visited on uplifted and responsive spirits.

## Ash Wednesday and Good Friday are days of Fasting and Abstinence from meat

On all other Fridays, except solemnities, the law of the common practice of penance is fulfilled by performing on of the following:

- Prayer
- Self-Denial
- Helping Others

All who have completed their eighteenth year and have not yet begun their sixtieth year are bound to fast. All who have completed their fourteenth year are bound to abstain from meat(Canon 1252)

The season of Lent is a time of penance..

Each of the faithful is obliged to received Holy Communion at least once per year. This precept must be fulfilled between Ash Wednesday, 10 February and Trinity Sunday 22 May 2016 unless for a good reason it is fulfilled at another time.

The Sacrament of Reconciliation is a gift from our merciful Father. All the faithful are bound to confess any grave sins at least once per year.

## 4 FEBRUARY 2016 MEDIA STATEMENT FROM BISHOP VINCENT LONG OFM CONV, AUSTRALIAN CATHOLIC BISHOPS DELEGATE FOR REFUGEES REGARDING THE HIGH COURT'S DECISION ON OFFSHORE PROCESSING

- "Following the High Court decision, the Australian Government's response to people seeking asylum–including babies born in Australia and their parents- should focus on protecting them from harm and respecting their human dignity."
- "I urge the Prime Minister Malcolm Turnbull and Minister for Immigration Peter Dutton to show compassion and mercy towards these families and not act in a way that will cause even more harm than has been done already."
- "The Catholic Church is prepared to collaborate with other community organisations to provide support for asylum seekers."
- "I urge the Australian Government to ensure that no child is subject to an unsafe and harmful environment and that no-one is returned to where they may face physical, psychological and sexual violence and harm."
- "The Catholic Church opposes mandatory detention and offshore detention because these policy responses do not respect the dignity of people seeking our help.
- "Governments have a responsibility to manage migration flows, but the Australian Government's current approach is harsh and should change." Bishop Vincent Long is the Australian Catholic Bishops spokesman on refugees and a former refugee.
