#### JESUS-HUMAN LIKE US

Every first Sunday of Lent has the gospel account of Jesus being human having to face temptations from the devil. There are three temptations (Luke 4:1-13). The first temptation was to miraculously feed himself-is his ministry to be about himself or others? The second temptation was to dominate the world, not to be a servant, while the third temptation was about grandstanding, throwing himself off the top of the high Temple.

#### **MODERN TEMPTATIONS**

We can translate the three temptations of Jesus into saying: I want the whole world to satisfy me— be self-centered; I want to exercise power and control over others; I want to take stupid risks and be unharmed eg. Drink too much alcohol and drive too fast. The great spiritual writer, St Ignatius of Loyola tells us the worst temptations are greed, pride and riches (not sex).

#### **DEALING WITH TEMPTATIONS**

Temptation is not sin, and hence does not need to be forgiven. Sin only comes when we freely and knowingly choose to act on temptation. Temptations appear often as good, but are destructive in the end. The more we give into temptation, the easier it becomes and we develop sinful habits. Finally, temptations should be dismissed quickly.

#### LIVING LENT

The 40 days that Jesus spent praying and preparing in the wilderness is reflected in the season of Lent that lasts 40 days from Ash Wednesday until the day before Easter Sunday (not counting Sundays in the season). It has been traditional that during the time of Lent Christian people renew their efforts in prayer, fasting and almsgiving. All three of these practices are actions of preparation. Just as Jesus prepared for his ministry in the wilderness, so too is Lent an opportunity for us to be deliberate about our reflection on what we are called to do in this world.

Many of our parishioners began Lent well by participating in one of our three Masses in full churches on Ash Wednesday.

#### FR JOHN SPILLANE- A GENTLE PASTOR

Was a priest for 68 years before the Lord called him home last week. During his ministry, he was parish priest for 46 years at Doncaster, West Brunswick and finally West Essendon from where he retired at the age of 83 years in 2006. He was known to be gentle, kind and a great visitor to his parishioners in their homes. Fr Greg Bourke preached beautifully at Fr John's funeral last Thursday. Fr John and his group of close priest friends holidayed in northern New South Wales every year— no wonder he lived a long healthy life!

#### Lent 2016

The Lenten season has a twofold character:

- It recalls baptism or prepares for it
- It stresses a penitential spirit

By these means especially, Lent readies the faithful for celebrating the paschal mystery after a period of closer attention to the Word of God, and more ardent prayer. In the liturgy itself and in the liturgy centred instructions, these baptismal and penitential themes should be more pronounced.

Hence,

- Wider use is to be made of baptismal features proper to the Lenten liturgy
- The same approach holds for the penitential elements

During Lent, penance should not be only internal and individual but also external and social...

In any event, let the paschal fast be kept sacred. It should be observed everywhere on Good Friday and, where possible prolonged throughout Holy Saturday, so that the joys of the Sunday of the resurrection may be visited on uplifted and responsive spirits.

# Ash Wednesday and Good Friday are days of Fasting and Abstinence from meat

On all other Fridays, except solemnities, the law of the common practice of penance is fulfilled by performing on of the following:

- Prayer
- Self-Denial
- Helping Others

All who have completed their eighteenth year and have not yet begun their sixtieth year are bound to fast. All who have completed their fourteenth year are bound to abstain from meat(Canon 1252)

The season of Lent is a time of penance..

Each of the faithful is obliged to received Holy Communion at least once per year. This precept must be fulfilled between Ash Wednesday and Trinity Sunday 22 May 2016 unless for a good reason it is fulfilled at another time.

The Sacrament of Reconciliation is a gift from our merciful Father. All the faithful are bound to confess any grave sins at least once per year.

# 4 FEBRUARY 2016 MEDIA STATEMENT FROM BISHOP VINCENT LONG OFM CONV, AUSTRALIAN CATHOLIC BISHOPS DELEGATE FOR REFUGEES REGARDING THE HIGH COURT'S DECISION ON OFFSHORE PROCESSING

"Following the High Court decision, the Australian Government's response to people seeking asylum–including babies born in Australia and their parents- should focus on protecting them from harm and respecting their human dignity."

- "I urge the Prime Minister Malcolm Turnbull and Minister for Immigration Peter Dutton to show compassion and mercy towards these families and not act in a way that will cause even more harm than has been done already."
- "The Catholic Church is prepared to collaborate with other community organisations to provide support for asylum seekers."
- "I urge the Australian Government to ensure that no child is subject to an unsafe and harmful environment and that no-one is returned to where they may face physical, psychological and sexual violence and harm."
- "The Catholic Church opposes mandatory detention and offshore detention because these policy responses do not respect the dignity of people seeking our help.
- "Governments have a responsibility to manage migration flows, but the Australian Government's current approach is harsh and should change."

  Bishop Vincent Long is the Australian Catholic Bishops spokesman on refugees and a former refugee.

#### **LENT FOCUS: YEAR OF MERCY:**

Saturday 26 March

One of the corporal works of mercy is to feed the hungry. One "angel" of grace for our times was Dorothy Day. She embodied living out the corporal works of mercy, especially 'feeding the hungry'...... Dorothy would insist "Those who cannot see the face of Christ in the poor are atheists indeed". Dorothy Day reminds us that we are here to follow Christ. Christ has told us plainly about the Last Judgment. We will be judged on our readiness to let the mercy of God pass through us to others. One of the Spiritual Works of mercy is to admonish sinners. "Admonish" means speak sternly and is a verb— a doing word. It is an act of speaking to someone who is making some bad choices in their life so that they might be able to change their ways and make some wiser choices. The word 'admonish' is not necessarily a tone we need to take. It would be better to establish a rapport with someone who needs guidance so as to build a respectful relationship and then give guidance and support which would probably get a better outcome than the 'stern' words which could be patronizing and belittling to an already fragile soul.
