LENT FOCUS: YEAR OF MERCY: One of the corporal works of mercy is to clothe the naked: Matthew 25 reminds us 'Then the king will say to those at his right hand, 'Come, you that are blessed by my Father, inherit the kingdom prepared for you from the foundation of the world; ³⁵for I was hungry and you gave me food, I was thirsty and you gave me something to drink, I was a stranger and you welcomed me, ³⁶I was naked and you gave me clothing, I was sick and you took care of me, I was in prison and you visited me.' ³⁷Then the righteous will answer him, 'Lord, when was it that we saw you hungry and gave you food, or thirsty and gave you something to drink? ³⁸And when was it that we saw you a stranger and welcomed you, or naked and gave you clothing? ³⁹And when was it that we saw you sick or in prison and visited you?' ⁴⁰And the king will answer them, 'Truly I tell you, just as you did it to one of the least of these who are members of my family, you did it to me.'

Corporal work of mercy is to bury the dead: Our faith in the Resurrection does not mean we can avoid the truth of death. In fact, in the prayer of the Hail Mary we say "pray for us now and at the hour of our death". No wonder then the care and love we as Christians give when we lovingly 'bury the dead'. Every person deserves the beauty and dignity of being lovingly farewelled. In the Irish tradition, there is the beautiful practice of the 'wake'- where friends and relatives hold vigil and 'accompany' the deceased person before the final rites of the Church. The body is reverenced and blessed because it is the 'seed' being planted that will rise to new life. One of the greatest challenges in this work of mercy is 'letting go'. A consolation is that our memories don't leave us. From Archbishop's Office for Evangelisation reflections written by Br Mark O'Connor FMS and originally published in Kairos Vol 22.

One of the Spiritual Works of mercy is to forgive offenses willingly: in last weekends Gospel of the woman caught in adultery, Jesus did not condemn her even though the law of Moses would have had her stoned to death. Glad to see that Jesus, who knew the law of Moses, did what was right not what was lawful. Forgiveness is the most common message Jesus gives us throughout the Gospel. We are forgiven countlessly by God our merciful Father, so we should extend this forgiveness to those around us who have sinned against us.

Spiritual Work of mercy to pray for the living and the dead: how fortunate we are in our Parish to have Ministers of Communion living out this Spiritual Work of mercy on a daily basis. They live this work by visiting the lonely, housebound, sick, elderly parishioners who cannot get to church. The need for parishioners to receive Communion is very real. The Ministers of Communion and care workers help keep the dignity of those they care for. When they die, many of the Communion Ministers and carers come to the funeral of those they cared for. Their memories of the deceased stays with them and they also lend support to the families of the deceased at their time of loss.
