THE INSPIRATION OF THE ANZACS

Because the bodies of the deceased soldiers were not brought back to Australia to be buried and hence have a tombstone, after the First World War, towns and cities built war memorials to honour the memory of their fallen. On many of the memorials were inscribed: "No man hath greater love than to lay down his life for his friends". (John 15:13)

Those who gave their lives for their country are living out the words of Jesus in today's gospel: "I give you a new commandment: love one another; just as I have loved you, you also must love one another" (John 13:34)

SELFLESS LOVE—A NEW COMMANDMENT

In the Hebrew scripture (Old Testament) there were the two commandments: love God and love your neighbour as yourself.

At the Last Supper, once Judas has departed to carry out his betrayal of Jesus, Christ closets his disciples and teaches them that his love is sacrificial. He tells the disciples (and us), that the way they behave towards one another must be with the same love that Jesus treated them. At the Last Supper, as he gave himself to the disciples under the form of bread and wine.

"This is my body which will be given for you"..."this cup is the new covenant in my blood which will be poured out for you " (on the cross) (Luke 22:20)

EXAMPLES OF TRUE LOVE TODAY

Are often seen in families where parents give themselves to the care of their children, even when it seems their care is not appreciated. It's the love seen when adult children give themselves to the care of an aged parent who can no longer remember them.

When a mother or a father sits by the hospital bedside of their child suffering terribly, invariably such a parent will say "I would rather suffer and die than see my child suffer and die".

SACRIFICIAL LOVE IS NEVER DESTRUCTIVE

While sacrificial love demands of us that we die unto self, Jesus never asked us to 'kill' ourselves. The distinction matters. We should not put up with undignified behaviour from others. Sacrificial love is never destructive. It is a free gift where we sometimes forego other options, opportunities and even good things for a love and life that is even better. The Lord laid down his life for us and in turn the Father raised him up to glorified life. What's true for him is true for us. We lay down our lives for each other so we can take up a new and richer life. We are never meant to destroy ourselves or stay in relationships that rip our dignity from us. Sometimes the most Christian thing we can do is to set up boundaries or make decisions that protect ourselves from behavior which is neither loving nor Christian.

CYRIL BLAKE—PASTOR—MISSIONARY

Cyril was ordained a priest for the Melbourne Church in 1958. At 85 years he was still ministering in the team ministry of the Bentleigh / Bentleigh East / Moorabbin Parish until he entered eternal life last Saturday after fatally being injured in a fall at Hall's Gap. One of seven children, Cyril had many nieces and nephews who have written wonderful attributes in the daily press: "Your faith nurtured, guided and blessed us; your love strengthened us. Your mind and creativity inspired us "" few have given so much, for so many, so freely...."

Between 1969 and 1981, Cyril worked tirelessly in southern remote Papua New Guinea in the Melbourne Overseas Mission. There he built a church, schools, medical facilities, agricultural facilities and an airstrip— transforming the lives of the indigenous peoples in a most remote area. In return, he was deeply loved and respected by the Kamea people.

Returning to Melbourne he was appointed Parish Priest of Highett for 25 years before he retired as pastor in 2011 and moved to the Moorabbin Presbytery. His funeral Mass is on Tuesday at 2pm in St Paul's Church Bentleigh.

JEWISH PASSOVER 2016: was celebrated on Friday. The feast has been held for over 3,000 years to remember the Jews passing from the slavery of Egypt over the Red Sea into the Promised Land. In 1965, 2,000 Catholic Bishops with Pope Paul VI taught the Jews have always been God's chosen people and hence they are our elder sisters and brothers in the faith. Let us work that peoples of all religions can live peacefully together.

CATHOLICS SHELTERED JEWS: "Compass", on ABCTV last Sunday narrated how a Sydney solicitor's mother, as a 8 year old child in Poland, was sheltered by Maria, a Catholic in her farm barn in 1942. Soon, the Nazi's came and took over the farm house while the girl remained out of sight for two years. After the Nazis left in 1946 she was taken in by the local Catholic priest who was already hiding fourteen Jews. "Compass" is on 6.30pm on Sunday and replayed on Monday at 11am. This week, the program is on Archbishop Mannix and Billy Hughes.
