LOVE

'Love' is that four-letter word that means one hundred different things to one hundred different people. In the Old Testament 'love' has many meanings. As in the modern world, it describes the strong attraction and powerful feelings experienced by men and women in their relationships with one another (Gen 24:67; 29:20; Song 1-8). Some prophets and poets compared God's love for his people with the love relationship between husband and wife. The deep love of a bride and groom in the Song of Songs was understood by some to describe the deep love of God for his people. The prophet Hosea said that Israel's failure to obey God was akin to a woman who was unfaithful to her husband (Hos 2), but that God would act to rebuild this broken relationship (Hos 3).

But Christian love, the love preached by Jesus, is a very different sort of love. In the Gospels Jesus taught his disciples to follow the commands to love God and their neighbour as they love themselves (Mk 12: 28-33; Mt 22: 34-40), and when he was pressed with the question: 'Who is my neighbour?' Jesus related the parable of the Good Samaritan (Lk 10: 29-37). In his famous 'Sermon on the Mount' Jesus tells his disciples that they are even to love their enemies, since this is what God does (Mt 5: 43-48). However, John, in his Gospel, gives clear attention both to God's love for the world (Jn 3:16) and to the love that members of the community of Christ's followers are to have for each other (Jn13: 34-35).

Now, since last Sunday's Gospel was an extract from John chapter 13, I feel we need to examine the full meaning of the 'new commandment' of love that Jesus gave his disciples. This 'new commandment' plumbs the depth of Christian love. Jesus said, 'No one can have greater love than this, than to lay down one's life for one's friend' (Jn 15:13). Jesus did not only preach this 'love', he lived it to its absolute limit. What is 'new' in the 'new commandment' Jesus enjoins on his disciples? The answer is this: 'you must love one another "as I have loved you". To love 'unto death', as Jesus did, is the benchmark of Christian love. The cross is not just a place of suffering. It is the place where we can see how much God loves us. The standard of Christian love, therefore, must be measured against the sacrificial love of Christ. It is a love that gives unto death, a love that excludes no one. The love that flows from Jesus is not confined to neighbour or close friends. His love reaches out to enemies and those who did him harm. Jesus shared his bread with Judas, and he washed his betrayer's feet, even though he knew Judas was about to betray him.

As baptized Christians we are called to this supreme love exemplified by Christ. To love one another as Christ loved us is a tall order which is not easily reached except through extraordinary grace. However, the lifestyle of the early Christians must have come quite close to the ideal. They gave powerful witness to the presence of the Lord among them. "See how these Christians love one another!"
