#### HOLY TRINITY—A COMMUNITY OF LOVE

One of the greatest teachers of all times, St Augustine, who was baptized as an adult in Milan, Italy at the Easter Vigil in 379AD described the Trinity in terms of the lover (the Father), the beloved (the Son) and love which exists between them (the Holy Spirit).

The Australian Salesian theologian, Fr Frank Maloney SDB in 1991 wrote: "At the heart of the mystery of the Trinity is a Father whose love is incarnated in the Son who gives life to the world, and in the mutual love which exists between the Father and the Son and touches our lives as the Holy Spirit."

Today, we rejoice that we are led to complete truth and understanding through the actions of the Spirit leading us to the Father and the Son. Jesus teaches us this in today's gospel, John 16: 12-15.

One of the simplest and yet greatest of the prayers expressing our belief in our Triune God (three persons in one) is the sign of the cross that we pray at the beginning of all our prayer and worship: "in the name of the Father, and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit."

**IMAGES OF THE TRINITY** St Patrick reportedly used the shamrock to explain the three persons in one God to the pagans of Ireland.

The most famous icon of the Trinity is by Andrei Rublev (1360-1430) of Moscow. An icon is a window out of the obvious realities of everyday life into the realm of God. Icons are religious images that hover between two worlds, putting into colours and shapes what cannot be grasped by the intellect. Rendering the invisible, visible.

The icon has three figures seated around the table—the Father, the Son and the Holy Spirit. There is a space at the table for us, we are invited in .... Come. On the table is a chalice, symbol of the Eucharist.

"A VOTE FOR THE VOICELESS" Is the statement of the Australian Catholic on the Election in July. The bishops quote Pope Francis on the danger that the economy can become a false god. "This leads to what this Pope has called the throwaway culture—a culture of over consumption where all kinds of things are thrown away, wasted, even human beings. The voices of the thrown away people will not be heard in the long and rowdy campaign."

Among the people discarded in this throw away culture are: refugees and asylum seekers, indigenous peoples, survivors of sexual abuse, sufferers of family violence, those in the womb, the elderly, those with mental illness, those suffering addiction, victims of enslavement, and the desperately poor beyond our shores. The full text of two pages is on the internet.

**SALESIAN COLLEGE SUNBURY—NEW BADGE / LOGO:** After consultation over 18 months, the new logo was released on Friday. This is the third logo in ninety years of the College. There are four parts of the logo—a circle representing community, a S for Salesian charism, an anchor a sign of steadfastness and hope, a cross, a central symbol of Catholic faith. The traditional colours of blue and gold are retained.



#### OUR HISTORY, OUR STORY, OUR FUTURE.

**SORRY DAY** is celebrated on Thursday 26<sup>th</sup> May and **NATIONAL RECON- CILIATION WEEK** begins on 27<sup>th</sup> May. Sorry Day is not to be confused with Apology Day when Prime Minister Kevin Rudd apologised to the Stolen Generation in February 2008.

On 26th May 1997 an Inquiry into Aboriginal Children Taken Away resulted in a Report 'Bringing Them Home' tabled in Federal Parliament on the eve of Reconciliation Week. It recommended that a 'Sorry Day' be held on this day annually. This happened and has continued to happen. A year later over half a million people responded, signing Sorry Books and taking part in ceremonies. In May 1999, this people's movement launched a 'Journey of Healing'. The date 27th May recalls the 1967 Referendum when more than 90% of Australians voted to amend the Constitution to include Aboriginal people in the census and allow the Commonwealth to make laws for them.

Reconciliation Week ends with June 3<sup>rd</sup> being the anniversary of the Mabo Declaration that *TERRA NULLIUS NEVER WAS.* 

It was during Reconciliation Week in 2006 that our Parish hosted one of the Message Sticks relaying around Australia bearing the message of Reconciliation. There are many activities and events on offer during Reconciliation Week and they can be found on the Reconciliation Victoria website www.reconciliationvic.org.au.

INFANT VIABILITY BILL: On May 25th the Victorian Legislative Council will debate the INFANT VIABILITY BILL introduced to the parliament by Dr Rachael Carling Jenkins in October last year. This bill is the first formal attempt at pro-life legislation in Victoria in decades, and the first legislative attempt to remedy, at least in part, the ultra permissive Victorian abortion law reforms of 2008 currently allowing late term abortion up to 9 months gestation, and no requirement to offer support or counselling to pregnant women. The success of the Bill relies heavily on the support it receives from the public. Please seriously consider supporting this bill by writing to your Victorian State members Josh Bull (joshbull@parliament.vic.gov.au) and Mary-Anne Thomas (mary-anne.thomas@parliament.vic.gov.au) in support of the Infant Viability Bill. Winding back the scourge of the Victorian abortion law Reforms of 2008 is not impossible—but to do so Victoria needs your voice and your action.
