THE PHARISEE AND THE WOMAN: Luke 7:36-50

To understand today's gospel it might help if we first set the scene. The scene is the courtyard of the house of Simon the Pharisee. The houses of well-to-do people were built around an open courtyard in the shape of a hollow square. Often in the courtyard there would be a garden and a fountain; and there in the warm weather meals were eaten 'al fresco'. It was the custom that when a Rabbi was the invited guest, all kinds of people wandered in to listen to the pearls of wisdom which might fall from his lips. These people, including the woman of ill repute, were not gate-crushing the party.

When a guest entered the courtyard three things were always done. (i) The host, as a gesture of welcome, placed his hand on the guest's shoulder and gave him the kiss of peace. (ii) As the roads were dusty tracks, the host saw to it that the servants poured water over the feet of guests to cleanse and to cool them. (iii) As a mark of respect the head of each guest was anointed with fragrant oil. None of these courtesies were afforded to Jesus.

Why did Simon invite Jesus to his house? Was Simon a secret admirer and sympathiser of Jesus? If he was, he would have afforded Jesus the customary courtesies. Was Simon a schemer? Was he hoping Jesus would say or do something that would incriminate him? Nothing in the story suggests that Simon had such a malicious intent. Jesus was a wandering bedraggled preacher. More than likely, Simon invited Jesus not out of malice but out of mere curiosity.

Simon has a name; Jesus has a name; but the other character in the story has no name. All she had was a reputation, and not a good one at that. She had no name, only a 'bad name'. She might have listened to Jesus teaching the crowds before this day. She might have been on the edge of the circling crowd and caught snatches of what Jesus was saying. Always on the outer she might have listened to what others were saying about Jesus, namely that he is the friend of tax collectors and sinners. As a sinner she felt drawn to this man who would not turn her away. This 'bad' woman must have been struck by the person and teaching of Jesus and was given the grace to repent. She needed to put her life together...to reach reconciliation within herself. She found in Jesus acceptance and forgiveness.

In the Middle East the dinner guests did not sit on chairs. They reclined on low couches, resting on their left elbow, leaving the right arm free, with the feet stretched out behind. During the meal sandals were removed. The woman was then able to come behind Jesus and minister to his feet. Jesus interpreted her ministry as acts of love and as signs of gratitude for sins forgiven.

Having filled in the background to this dinner scene, we should now be in a better position to reflect on the teaching of Jesus that flows out of the story of Simon and the un-named woman. Many of the important actions in Luke's Gospel take place at tables. At the same time many important teachings of Jesus were delivered at tables. The Eucharist is probably our best source of spiritual nourishment. At the Eucharist we are nourished by the Body and Blood of Christ in Holy Communion. But let us not forget that we are also nourished at the 'Table of the Word'.
