ALL OR NOTHING CHRISTIANS

Elite sports people– for example the Paralympians or finals footballers– know they must make choices in times of preparation. They must train, eat the right food, sleep sufficient hours. They must make choices.

The wisdom from which the first reading (Wisdom 9:13-16) is taken is rooted in the fact that life is a series of choices. The epistle (Philemon 9:10-17) and the gospel reading (Luke 14:25-33) provide us with examples of the way Christians should choose. Finally, the psalm's description of the fleeting nature of life sets the context and tone of our decision-making.

Discipleship demands that, in the face of all the choices available to us, we keep our priorities straight. In the gospel, Jesus insists that we must be single minded. We must cling to the one thing necessary, and that one thing is authentic discipleship. In choosing Jesus, we choose other things as well. We choose new relationships with the very people to whom we have already been committed. Those who were slaves, or lower class, or employees, or providers of service are now regarded as sisters and brothers in Christ. In choosing Jesus, we also choose the cross. We choose to live in a way that calls us to travel the high road: to forgive offences committed against us; to live simply so that others can simply live; to take responsibility for the moral character of society.

The fleeting nature of life as characterized in the psalm forces us to look at the meaning of life. When the day dawns for us to return to dust, what will we have gained from life? The realization of our finiteness and the transitory nature of life should help us to set our priorities right and should give us the courage to remain faithful to them.....Dianne Bergant CSS

SAMOAN YOUNG MEN: from Salesian Technical College Samoa gave us such uplifting experiences last Sunday. Their singing, their prayerfulness and their dancing inspired us. We thank them for their visit, led by Fr Chris Ford SDB, a former student and teacher at Sunbury Salesian College. Our parishioners at Mass were very generous donating \$4500 towards extending the building of their college in Samoa.

A WAKE-UP CALL TO THE YOUNG: 1.6 million young Catholics gathered in Krakow Poland for World Youth day a month ago. Pope Francis spent several days in Poland, seeking to inspire the young to leave their own distinctive mark on the world. Francis urged them not to be 'couch potatoes", to switch off their video games and go out to the world's outcasts in particular, to seek out migrants and refugees. The Pope urged them to talk to their grandparents, to cultivate a 'memory' of their identity of who they really are.

At the prayer vigil, Francis urged the young people to consider becoming politicians and social activists, to ensure that their faith would lead to concrete actions.

World Youth Day s (WYD) have inspired young people: some pilgrims who meet will go on to marry, others discern a religious vocation. One third of seminarians in the USA have attended a WYD.

PREPARATION EVENING FOR CONFIRMATION: was held last Tuesday led by Sr Rita Malavisi RSJ. Over a hundred Candidates with their parents heard inspiring words and shared together. The session leaflet had these words on the cover


