Our readings this week really resonate the message of Social Justice. Below is part of a statement from the Australian Bishops' Social Justice Statement.

SOCIAL JUSTICE SUNDAY 25 SEPTEMBER; This year, the Australian Bishops' Social Justice Statement is titled: 'A PLACE AT THE TABLE: Social Justice in an Ageing Society'. The Statement celebrates the value and dignity of older people in Australian life. It challenges us to recognise their significant contribution to society and emphasises that this contribution should not be valued in mere economic terms. The Statement calls for justice for those who are most vulnerable and warns about a view of older people as burdensome or dispensable. From the Statement comes this beautiful reflection by Pope Francis:

There was a father, mother and their many children, and a grandfather lived with them.

He was quite old, and when he was at table eating soup, he would get everything dirty: his mouth, the serviette ... it was not a pretty sight!

One day the father said that, given what was happening to the grandfather, from that day forward he would eat alone.

And so he bought a little table, and placed it in the kitchen. And so the grandfather ate alone in the kitchen while the family ate in the dining room.

After some days, the father returned home from work and found one of his children playing with wood.

He asked him: 'What are you doing?'

to which the child replied: 'I am playing carpenter'. 'And what are you building?' the father asked.

'A table for you papa, for when you get old like grandpa'.

Everyone has a place at the table!

At all Masses today, after Communion, we have a piece dedicated to International Peace Day on 21 September. Please reflect on this as you consider Peace, Mercy & Justice in your life and those around you.

Even more, by your Spirit you move human hearts
That enemies may speak to each other again,
Adversaries join hands
And people seek to meet together
By the working of Your power
It comes about, O Lord
That hatred is overcome by love
Revenge gives way to forgiveness
And discord is changed to mutual respect

Our gospel reading today from Luke (16:19-31) about the rich man and Lazarus speaks to us of the issues of the poor and how their needs can be ignored so easily. As children of God, we need to reach out to those in need. In this Year of Mercy, we are called to consider the needs of others and help make the world a better place. Restore dignity to those who find themselves compromised by whatever circumstances. It was Jesus who taught us that we need to reach out. He dined with sinners when he could have dined with Pharisees. He came to understand the path of the poor and chose to make a difference in their life by being compassionate and merciful and caring and loving to those in need.

Pope Francis says "A true builder of peace is one who takes the first step toward the other. This is not weakness but strength, the strength of peace. How can the wars in the world end if we are not able to overcome our small misunderstandings and quarrels? Our acts of dialogue, forgiveness, reconciliation, are the "bricks" needed to build the framework of peace." 2015

6PM MASS REVIEW: Currently our Parish is reviewing Mass Times for the Saturday night Mass. Currently Mass is held every Saturday night at 6pm. AUSTRALIAN JESUITS IN INDIA: went from Australia including Melbourne in 1951 to the poorest people in Northern India where they were not allowed to own land. Over the years these priests have raised up these people by providing fine education. They have inculturated Christianity with some Indian concepts. Their story was movingly told on ABC TV "Compass" last Sunday. It was obvious how well the people and the Australian priests related together. Their priests shared their Aussie humour among themselves. Most of them are still there after 65 years.

OUR PRAYERFUL SYMPATHY: we offer to the family of Maria Conversano whose funeral Mass was celebrated on Friday. As a seven year old girl she carried her sister Carmelina to an air raid shelter to escape the bombing during the War in central Italy. In 1956 Maria came to Australia and with her husband Gino, they had five children. Carmelina also came and the two sisters spoke on the phone every day. Maria came to Goonawarra Aged Facility in 2014 where she was well served by our Ministers of Communion.

OUR PRAYERFUL SYMPATHY: we offer the family of Chris Kavanagh, aged 28 years who was fatally injured in a traffic collision. He attended St Anne's School and Salesian College. He became a leading hand in the construction industry. We offer our sympathy to his parents Jo and Ken and to his siblings Tony, Kathy, John and Alex on the sudden loss of their loved son and brother. His funeral was held Friday concluding with the committal at Riddells Creek Cemetery.

SUNBURY INTER-CHURCH COUNCIL: will meet on Tuesday at 7.30pm at St Mary's Parish House. The major item on the agenda is organizing Christmas on the Green.

CONSULTATION ON THE NEW ARCHBISHOP: Vatican II taught priest should promote the special role of laity and to listen to lay people. (The decree Priests No. 9 1965) This teaching was put into church law in 1983: "Christ's faithful have the right, indeed at times the duty... to manifest to the sacred Pastors their views on the matters which concern the good of the Church." (Canon 212 pa 3)

Archbishop Denis Hart has reached 75 years, the age when bishops are to offer their resignation so the Pope can appoint a new archbishop in due course.
