OUR PERCEPTION OF OTHER HUMAN BEINGS

Recently I heard an account of a university professor of African American descent sitting on the porch of his house in USA when police driving past stopped and questioned him rigorously why he was sitting there in that affluent neighbourhood.

Lately, We have seen police shootings of seemingly innocent African Americans in the US. Here, in Australia, we have had some alarmingly racist attacks on our indigenous brothers and sisters. In 2014, a 22 year old indigenous woman died in police custody in WA, detained for not paying some fines. Her family are asking the coroner to release CCTV tapes of her mistreatment. A few months ago, we were shocked by the video scenes of the mistreatments of indigenous youth in the Don Dale Detention centre, Darwin. At our Australian Priests Convention attended by 134 priests, Bishop Eugene Hurley of Darwin spoke to us of his washing the feet of youth detained. He said how we treat people is how we perceive them.

The following reflection by Fr Michael Tate of Hobart supports how crucial is our perception of others:

The loving gaze of a mother towards her newborn simply gives rise to the obligation to feed the baby. There is no special reward for doing her motherly duty. This is how Jesus sees 'good works'. If we perceive our relationships with people correctly, then so-called 'good works' are no more than our duty and don't deserve special congratulatory access to Heaven.

If we saw human beings as 'formed from the dust of the earth, . . . a manifestation of God in the world, a sign of his presence, a trace of his glory' (St John Paul II, Evangelium Vitae 34.2), then that perception leads to certain ways of relating which are obliging. Like the servant in the story, we will have done no more than our duty.

We might take a moment to pause to get our perception of human beings correct so that our response may prepare us for the free gift of heavenly life.

OUR PRAYERFUL SYMPATHY: we offer to Mary Buchanan as her husband Bob suddenly entered eternal life at home last week. Mary and Bob came to our parish in 1968. They were blessed with four children, the first students at St Anne's School. Bob was an aircraft engineer. His funeral will be on Wednesday at 11.30am concluding with the committal at Sunbury Cemetery.

CONSULTATION ON THE NEW ARCHBISHOP: Vatican II taught priest should promote the special role of laity and to listen to lay people. (The decree Priests No. 9 1965) This teaching was put into church law in 1983: "Christ's faithful have the right, indeed at times the duty... to manifest to the sacred Pastors their views on the matters which concern the good of the Church." (Canon 212 pa 3)
