PERSEVERING IN PRAYER

A Reflection on Prayer

The dominant theme of today's readings is that of prayer. The lesson taken from the first reading and the gospel is that prayer is more than a matter of short sprints. If we want something desperately we need stamina and perseverance. Above all, we need faith that does not waver in its trust in God. The story of Moses in the first reading provides us with a vivid picture. As long as Moses can hold his arms up the battle goes in favour of the Israelite army, but as soon as his arms fall limp the battle fortunes go the other way. Uplifted arms are symbolic of an uplifted heart, but limp arms symbolise a wavering heart.

The parable of the persistent widow is one of those "how-much-more" stories. If the judge, who was unjust and heartless, was moved by the widow's persistence, how much more will God, so just, loving and caring, take every cry to heart? The only area open to question is the strength of our faith: if our faith perseveres and does not waver, then our prayer for justice will be answered. Unwavering faith in God is the requirement of every prayer. Hence the final question in the gospel: 'When the Son of Man comes, will he find any faith on earth?' Perhaps Luke intended this segment of the gospel as a warning to the community of his time, some of whom were defecting from the faith under persecution from unjust judges.


