THE BIRTH OF CHRIST AND JOSEPH

There are only two accounts of the birth of Jesus in the gospels, in Luke and in Matthew. Today we hear from Matthew who wrote for a Jewish Christian Community. He wants to establish that Jesus is descended from David, Israel's ideal shepherd-king. To achieve this Matthew focuses on Joseph rather than on Mary because Joseph is of David's line. According to the customs of a patriarchal society Jesus himself becomes a "son of David"

Joseph is presented to us as an icon of faith and integrity. He is open to God's plan which is beyond his dreams. Joseph surrenders himself to God's mysterious purposes and is guided by the Spirit of God.

On a visit to the Philippines in 2015, Pope Francis said on his table in his residence he has an image of St Joseph sleeping, and when he has a problem, he writes a little note and puts it underneath St Joseph so that he can dream about it.

In the gospels, Joseph is found twice resting as an angel reveals God's will to him in his dreams. Pope Francis continued that dreaming is very important in families. "How many difficulties in married life are resolved when we leave room for dreaming, when we stop a moment to think of our spouse, and we dream about the goodness present in the good things all around us."

THE BIRTH OF CHRIST AND MARY

In December 1940, the famous French author Jean-Paul Sartre, an atheist wrote as a prisoner in a Nazi internment camp, a nativity play for his fellow internees, including priests. A very tender portrait of Mary emerges: "She looks at her newborn child and thinks "This God is my son. The divine flesh is my flesh. He is made from me. He has my eyes, and the shape of his mouth is the shape of mine. He takes after me. He is God, and he takes after me. No other woman has ever had her God fall to her lot in this way. A small God whom I can take in my arms and cover with kisses. A warm God who breathes and smiles. A God who lives and whom I can touch.""

This is a great commentary of John's Gospel (1:14,18). "The Word was made flesh, he lived among us and is only the Son, who is nearest to the Father's heart who has made him known."

OUR SEASON OF THE BIRTH OF CHRISTMAS

The Christmas novena begins on 17 December. At this point, the Advent focus shifts to the Christmas story and the Virgin Mary. These days serve to prepare more directly for the Lord's birth.

While the retail stores take down their Christmas decoration on 26 December to prepare for the Boxing Day sales, our Christmas season continues to the 8 January, the Feast of the Epiphany.

Congratulations to Sahail and Salesian College: Sahail Balak of Salesian College Sunbury gained 99.1 ATAR, the highest at any school in our region which includes Sunbury and Gisborne. Congratulations to Sahail and to his teachers at the college. The number of students at Salesian in Year 12 gaining an ATAR of 90+ increased by 50% this year.

Marriage Annulment Applications: more people are seeking to have their failed marriage declared null by the Church since Pope Francis streamlined the procedures. In Germany the increase of 50%, in England 100% while our state of Victoria has seen 300% increase.

Christmas on the Green: last Saturday was attended by about 2500 people, the largest in 30 years of Carols in Sunbury. Those present donated \$1246 for food parcels distributed to those in need in Sunbury by Careworks.

Can we have peace in our country so we can have peace in our world? Yes we can but it takes all of us....we still haven't got it right so we must keep trying.

IMPLEMENTATION OF THE VICTORIAN GOVERNMENT'S CHILD SAFE STANDARDS: The Victorian Government has introduced compulsory minimum Child Safe Standards that apply to organisations that provide services for children to help protect them from all forms of abuse. These are to be implemented by 1st January 2017. The emphasis of these new legislative requirements is to effect further cultural change; to attempt to change attitudes towards, and increase awareness of our obligations to the safety of our children. Our Parish has been working on these standards, in consultation with the Archdiocese, to build on our child safety measures already in place. A Child Safety Policy, Commitment to Children Statement, Reporting Child Abuse, Child Safety Code of Conduct, have been developed. FRENCH MUSLIMS MEET AT THE VATICAN: a delegation of the French Council of Muslim Faith (CFCM) joined in an inter religious meeting at the Vatican on 3 November. The president of CFCM, Anovar Kbibech said "Our meeting with the Pope reflects the new dynamism of fraternity and consensus that we have fostered among Christians and Muslims." The CFCM said it would distribute in its mosques in France the text of the Pope's address at the meeting: "May it never happen again that the religious, because the conduct of some of their followers, convey a distorted message, out of time with that of mercy."
