CHRIST—THE LIGHT OF THE WORLD

There was once a gathering of priests representing several religious Orders. In the middle of their conference the lights suddenly went out leaving them all in darkness. The Benedictine simply went on saying his Office which he knew by heart, anyway. The Franciscan knelt down and began to pray for light. The Dominican suggested to the others that they should inquire into the nature of light and consider the causes that might have led to its failure. But the Jesuit had left the room. He had gone to fix the fuse. (I wonder who was the author of this story? I quess it was a Jesuit.)

Today in the first reading and in the Gospel we hear that people in darkness have seen a great light, and for those who are caught up in the region and shadow of death light has dawned. Matthew introduces Jesus as the Light of the World and as the light to the nations. God chose the Hebrew nation not with the idea that they were to have God all to themselves but that they would become a shining light to all the nations around them, to draw them to God and into the Circle of light.

Jesus operated mostly in Galilee, doing most of his preaching and working of miracles in that region. Matthew refers to that region as 'the Galilee of the nations or Galilee of the gentiles.' The Galileans were considered by Judeans as the 'lost sheep of the House of Israel.' In Galilee Jesus was able to minister to these 'lost sheep.' The gentiles feature prominently in Matthew's Gospel. Matthew's is the only Gospel that carries the story of the three Wise Men, the non-Jewish kings. It refers to Galilee as the melting pot of the nations. Matthew's Gospel ends with Jesus sending his apostles from Galilee out into the whole world to make disciples and baptize them in the name of the Father, Son and Holy Spirit.

In John's Gospel Jesus says of himself: 'I am the light of the world. 'Anyone who follows me will not be walking in darkness but will have the light of life.' The theme of light is very strong in John's Gospel. We will celebrate Christ the light in a very special way at the Easter vigil. We will light the Paschal Candle, the symbol of Christ 'the Light of the World'. From the Paschal Candle the light is passed on to all in the church. The same Paschal Candle is used at all baptisms for the following year as each new Christian is given the light of faith to be kept burning brightly. Christians must be a light to a dark world.

John Ruskin in the 19th century once sat with a friend in the twilight half an hour after sunset, and together they watched a lamplighter, torch in hand, lighting the street lights on a distant hill. Very soon the man's shape was no longer clear, but they could follow his progress as he lit another street light. 'There,' said Ruskin, that's what I mean by a real Christian. You can trace his course by the light that he leaves burning wherever he goes.'

ST ANNE'S SCHOOL: with increasing enrolment, there are two extra classrooms this year. Some renovations have been carried out during the school holidays in the Years 1 and 2 classrooms.

PRINCE CHARLES PRAISED: The charity, Aid to the Church in Need has praised the Prince of Wales' Christmas message in which he drew attention to the suffering of Christians in the Middle East. Speaking on the BBC, Prince Charles said that the suffering of those fleeing violent religious persecution in the Middle East and elsewhere echoed the suffering of the Holy Family.
