THE SEASON OF LENT

Lent lasts for forty days. We do penance for forty days because Jesus fasted for forty days in the desert. Why did Jesus choose forty not seven, ten or fifty? We look back at the Old Testament and there we find three stories. Noah and companions spent forty days in the ark. Moses spent forty days atop Mt Sinai receiving the Ten Commandments. The people of Israel spent forty years wandering around in the desert.

Why forty? Could it be that a human being normally has to spend forty weeks in the mother's womb before facing the world? Someone long ago decided that new things are well worth the wait. And all the biblical 40's were periods of waiting for something new.

Words like *new, anew, renew, renewal...* suggest that Lent is a preparation time for something new. Each of the biblical forties was a necessary prelude to the birth of something new. In Noah's case it was the birth of a new world following the destruction by flood of a sinful world. In Moses' case it was the birth of the new people of the covenant. For the wandering Israelites, it was the start of a new settled existence in the Promised Land. And what was it in the case of Jesus? It was the start of a new mission. Up to that point Jesus had been a carpenter. From this point forward Jesus was to establish a new Israel, a new people of God, a people liberated from the letter of the law and governed by the Spirit of love.

To achieve his purpose Jesus had to confront the old enemy and fight him for mastery. Referring back to the story of Moses and the Israelites, Pharaoh did not take kindly to the loss of his slaves and cheap labour. Likewise, when Jesus begins his mission of liberation, Satan, that other slave master, did not take kindly to this newcomer trespassing on his territory and threatening to snatch people from his grasp.

The testing of Jesus in the desert was a power struggle between the Lord of Light and the Prince of Darkness. It was a battle between the forces of Good and the forces of Evil. Jesus defeats all the clever tactics of Satan and comes out a winner. An even greater victory was to come later. When the forces of evil put Jesus to death, they thought they had won the day. They thought wrongly, because through his death on the cross and through his resurrection Jesus snatched victory from the jaws of defeat.

As we prepare for Easter what tactics shall we use to defeat the old enemy? Jesus used prayer, fasting and humble giving. It is suggested we use the same tactics. The season of Lent is about newness, but unfortunately we find it too easy to slip back into our old ways. We need help and support from God and from each other because it is so hard to walk alone. Lent is the liturgical season when we put special effort into the ongoing struggle against sin in our lives. We do this through forty days of prayer and self-discipline as we prepare to rise to new life with Christ at Easter. Jesus calls us to repent and believe the Good news. To repent is to turn away from a destructive path and to follow Jesus along a new path. Jesus overcame every temptation that would have diverted him from his mission so that he could lead us on the path to salvation.

LENT 2017: Lent is a time to recall our baptism and to seek to make ourselves better people by living true Christian values.

Ash Wednesday and Good Friday (14 April) are days of Fasting and abstinence from meat. On all other Fridays, except solemnities, the law of the common practice of penance is fulfilled by performing any one of the following:

- Prayer-personal or communal prayer in any form. Archbishop Hart recommends 15 minutes at night slowly reading, praying and reflecting on the daily gospel. Pope Francis reminds us that "The Word is a gift".
- Self Denial could include giving to Project Compassion or Fasting. Self Denial frees our mind and our resources. What money or time we do not spend on ourselves, we need to spend on the benefit of others.
- Helping Others

 look to our neighbours and family who may need support in any way. Don't forget the aged, the lonely, the sick, the refugees. If you can reach-out during Lent, it is a good time to start

Lent is an opportunity to improve the way we live out our Christian values and to make our lives and the lives of others better.
