3RD SUNDAY OF LENT

The Jewish people worshipped at the Temple in Jerusalem. The Samaritans to the north worshipped on Mount Gerizem. But Jesus says to the woman of Samaria: 'Believe me, woman, the hour is coming when you will worship the Father neither on this mountain nor in Jerusalem . . . true worshippers will worship the Father in spirit and truth.'

We do this by acknowledging Jesus Christ as *our* sacred site. Jesus is where God is to be found. In his earthly ministry this was around places like the well in Samaria. As Risen Lord, he is to be found in those in dire need, and in the Heavenly Bread. In both cases we need to incline the body as an act of worship: in the case of the needy, by doing something practical; in the case of the Heavenly Bread, by genuflecting, bowing, before the Blessed Sacrament.

We could pause for a moment to reorientate ourselves to the Sacred Site who is the Risen Christ, acknowledging him as indeed the 'Saviour of the World'.

POPE AND ANGLICAN LEADER INVITED TO SOUTH SUDAN

All the Christian leaders of South Sudan– Anglican, Presbyterian and Catholic– have asked Pope Francis: "Please come to South Sudan only for a day, but don't come alone, come with the Archbishop of Canterbury, Justin Welby."

The country is suffering a brutal civil war, resulting in widespread to economic breakdown and famine. Millions are starving.

Last year Pope Francis visited the war zone of the Central African Republic. Rather than being feted with the pomp and ceremony of a military band and met with children flag waving, the Pope landed at an airport in Bangui that was surrounded by a refugee camp. The papal visit brought a moment of peace and played a part in making last year's elections possible.

OUR PRAYERFUL SYMPATHY: we offer to Mary Sammut and her children Frank and Cynthia as Eddie Sammut entered eternal life last Friday aged 80 years. Eddie lived during the War in Malta until coming to Australia as a child migrant in 1950 on the same ship as our Father Bert. They both attended Christian Brothers Agricultural College in Tardon WA. Eddie and Mary came to our parish in 1989. Eddie was a church goer all his life. His Funeral Mass was celebrated on Thursday.

We offer to the family of Grace McKay who entered eternal life last Friday. Grace born in Scotland in 1924, came to Melbourne in 1963 with her husband Thomas and family. Eventually, Grace and Thomas who were married happily for 70 years, Thomas proceeded her into eternal life last March came to our parish in 1998. Both were worshippers at Mass all their lives. Grace entered Goonawarra Aged Facility in 2004 where our Ministers of Communion served her. Her Funeral Mass and committal were celebrated on Friday.

Can't find slavery-free Easter eggs in your supermarket? Did you know that the Easter eggs in Australian supermarkets might be made with cocoa beans picked by children, many of whom have been enslaved or forced to work in exploitative conditions with no access to education and other human rights? The International Labour Rights Forum (ILRF) estimates that there are 1.5 million children working in the cocoa sector in West Africa.

Action: When you go to your local supermarket, look for chocolate that has one of these three symbols. If you can't find any, ask the manager if they stock any.

LIES: this weekend our Prep students and families will be attending 10.30am Mass. On Tuesday and Wednesday last week our Prep families attended a PJ night at both St Anne's and Our Lady of Mount Carmel Primary Schools as the children and their families learnt more about their faith. The children have settled into school quickly and happily and are learning so much every day. This weekend, the children will be joining us as we celebrate Mass. PROJECT COMPASSION: is a way our parish supports almsgiving through helping Caritas Australia. Caritas is one of the major international aide agencies and they help build up marginalized areas around the world. Each Lent, we ask parishioners to take one of the boxes in each of our churches and donate to this very worthy cause. Caritas supports the Stolen Generation of Indigenous Australians who were forcibly taken from their families during the 1920's to 1970's. Some children were then subjected to abuse in their new homes, or not even sent to families but rather Children's Homes.
