ONE FEAST OVER THREE DAYS

Over these three days we proclaim Jesus' passion, death and resurrection. It is such an immense and awe-inspiring mystery that we need three days to enter its truth. The mystery is called the paschal mystery. We gaze at the mystery on Holy Thursday as Jesus kneels on the floor to wash feet, sits at the table for the Last Supper and anguishes in the garden of Gethsemane. On Good Friday we gaze at the Cross and on Easter Day, we are gazing in another garden and see the empty tomb. There is no attempt to soften either the sadness or the joy.

THE PASCHAL MYSTERY—THE NEW CREATION—THE NEW TREE OF LIFE

John's gospel presents Jesus as dying as a King and that Jesus is in complete control of his own destiny, with Jesus carrying his own cross.

John's passion begins and ends in a garden—a feature unique to John. Jesus's cross is erected in the middle of the garden. The tree of life was in the middle of the garden of Eden. His mother is called 'woman' the same term used for Eve in the Garden of Eden.

(Genesis 2:23)

Only in John's gospel, there is the scene where Jesus from the cross says: "Woman, this is your son. Then to the disciple he said, "This is your mother" (John 19:26) This changed the relationship between Jesus and his disciples. Now we share the same mother as he—we hence become his brothers and sisters.

The body of Jesus is buried in a new tomb in the garden. In John 2:19, Jesus said "destroy this temple and in three days I will raise it up".

The risen Lord appears to Mary Magdalene saying: "Go and tell my brothers and sisters, I go to my Father and your Father" (John 20:17).

Jesus and we share a relationship of being children of God. We by baptism are the Household of the Father—the New Temple.

"As I have washed your feet, you should wash each others feet".

At the Last Supper, Jesus shows he is Servant, one who is ready to do the dirty jobs, to be at the bottom of the social heap. He kneels on the floor to wash the feet. (John 13:15)

COMMUNITY APPROACH NEEDED TO PREVENT CHILD SEXUAL ABUSE: from 1 January 2017 new laws called Child Safety Standards (CSS) were put in place. The CSS are in place to change the culture of treatment of children and vulnerable adults. If anyone is aware of an instance of child abuse we are now legally required to report it. Anyone who does not report a known abuse situation can be legally charged.

EASTER MESSAGE FROM THE CHURCHES OF CHRIST IN AUS-

TRALIA: Annually, 2 million Australians will have an anxiety disorder. Among youth, one in six experience an anxiety disorder.

Some blame financial or relationship difficulties and international conflicts. I suggest beneath this is an unnamed spiritual anxiety. We have unresolved questions deep within our souls. Does my life have meaning, how do I deal with guilt, how can I find inner peace, how do I respond to the wrongs in our world?

The answer is the Easter message "Do not be afraid; for I know that you are looking for Jesus who has been crucified. He is not here, for He has risen, just as He said." (Matthew 28:5) - Rev Woodlock, Federal Co-ordinator.

INTERNATIONAL YOUTH CONFERENCE: 270 delegates from 103 countries met in Rome last week to prepare for the Synod on the Youth in October. Ashleigh Green, a social worker was the Australian delegate. Pope Francis told them he wants to hear their voices. "What is needed are young people who will go out on the street and move forward beside others. But looking forward to the future."

MINISTRY MONTH: On the weekends of 22 & 23 April and 29 & 30 April, we will hear of the great work done in our parish by so many. All the Parish Groups and Ministries are vital to the parish we have today. These are various groups within our Church community who support our parish. We welcome all parishioners to be involved in any way they feel would bring richness to their life and the lives of other parishioners.

The ministries that are on a roster generally have a rotation of between 4—8 weeks.

ALTAR CARE: Clean the Sanctuary space of the church on a roster basis.

ALTAR SERVERS: Assist the priest with Mass. Open to boys and girls who have celebrated First Communion.

<u>BAPTISM PREPARATION:</u> Instruct families wanting to baptise their children in the Catholic Faith. Sessions run once per month for 1 hour, currently 2 teams share month about.

BINGO HELPER: Help with running the parish bingo at the Sunbury Football Club every Thursday night.

<u>CATECHETICS</u>: Our parish runs a program for children attending Government schools who would like to celebrate their Sacraments. Leaders support the children and teach them about the faith.

<u>CHILDREN'S LITURGY OF THE WORD</u>: Bring the Word of God to the children in a way they can relate to and easily understand, through simple crafts, prayer and other activities.

CHURCH CLEANING: Both St Anne's and Our Lady of Mount Carmel churches are cleaned on a regularly.

CHURCH LINEN: Altar linen is used at every Mass and requires washing and ironing.

<u>COMMUNION TO THE HOUSEBOUND & AGED CARE FACILITIES</u>: This important ministry helps parishioners who can no longer get to Mass by bringing Communion and companionship to them. Some ministers attend to those at home and others attend the Nursing Homes.

COUNTING TEAM: Count and prepare the weekly collections for banking.

EMMAUS CHARISMATIC PRAYER GROUP: Meet every Thursday morning in the Chapel and is open to all who would like to pray in an uplifting environment.

EVERGREENS: Our Seniors members are always looking for people to join them for social gatherings and outings.

<u>GARDENING</u>: Our gardens need care and attention. Our volunteers do a great job and would appreciate any assistance.

GIFT SHOP: Is opened after Sunday Masses at St Anne's Church.

KNIGHTS OF THE SOUTHERN CROSS: An organization of catholic men who support the educational, charitable, religious and social welfare needs of the parish.

LAP TOP OPERATORS: Set up and run the laptop during Masses.

LECTORS: Proclaim the word of the Lord at Mass.

<u>LEGION OF MARY</u>: Meet every Tuesday to pray together and to reach out to parishioners by visitation to homes and to aged care facilities.

<u>MAINTENANCE</u>: Our parish consists of many buildings requiring constant maintenance and upkeep. We need volunteers who can assist with small odd jobs that need to be done.

MASS SET UP: Volunteers set up and pack up weekend Masses.

MINISTERS OF COMMUNION: Assist in the distribution of Holy Communion.

<u>MUSICIANS & SINGERS:</u> "When we sing we pray twice" is the saying. Volunteers who love to sing or play an instrument to uplift our Masses are warmly welcome.

<u>OVERSEAS HUMANITARIAN PROJECT</u>: This project has a small committee who coordinate the promotion of the needs of the orphans in Jakarta that our parish has been supporting since 2013.

<u>PARISH HISTORICAL GROUP</u>: Our small team preserve our parish's rich history. If you have a keen interest for history, please join in.

<u>PARISH POSTIES</u>: Our posties are energetic volunteers who deliver our Neighbourhood Newsletter, around their area to all our Catholic families three times per year.

<u>RCIA TEAM</u>: Are involved in Initiating Adults into the Catholic faith. They share their faith and journey with them toward their Christian Initiation. The team begins in July.

<u>SCHOOL CANTEEN HELPERS:</u> Both our school communities would welcome more helpers preparing lunches for our children.
