CHRIST WALKS WITH US ON OUR JOURNEY OF LIFE

Our gospel today (Luke 24:13-35) is one of the best known and loved post– Resurrection stories. The two disciples on the way to the village of Emmaus are so much like us on our journey at times moving from doubt to faith after reflected on the sacred scriptures and being nourished by the Eucharist.

THE WALK OUT: These disciples had been told by Jesus "Wait in Jerusalem", and here they are, leaving the community of dispirited disciples and walking out on Jesus.

At the beginning of Mass, we confess that we have gone off course, generally by our negligence.

THE GREAT LISTENER: Christ walks alongside us, even when we find ourselves travelling in the wrong direction. He wants to hear about where we are. He lets the disciples talk and express their doubts and disappointments. He listens. Only after they have experienced where they are, he opens the Hebrew (Old Testament) Scriptures. Let us be honest with God and tell him how we feel especially about our dashed hopes. God never gives up on us.

OUR HEARTS ON FIRE: The disciples had all the information– they knew of Jesus' death and the stories 'he is alive'. Their expectations of a political Messiah have been dashed. Jesus explains the scriptures in a way that their vision of God is expanded. Jesus opened their eyes that God could be present even in suffering and death. They move from intellectual information to an inner conversion of heart. This change of heart is the basis of faith.

HOSPITALITY REWARDED: reaching Emmaus, the two disciples invite their anonymous fellow-traveler to share a meal. They pressed him to stay with them, "It is nearly evening, and the day is almost over." He agrees, but becomes THEIR host! Around the table, THEY become his GUESTS!

He takes bread, blesses it and gives it to them to eat– the same actions as at the Last Supper. Their eyes are opened and they recognize their travelling companion as the Risen Lord.

RETURNING TO THE COMMUNITY: Reflecting on their experience, they return straight away to Jerusalem to share with the others what had happened on the road and at the meal. They discover the remaining disciples have their own Easter stories to relate. The sharing of stories deepens our communal experience of salvation. We are not made to be 'lone rangers'.

NEW PEOPLE AT THE TABLE OF THE LORD: next month 126 children of our parish will begin to share from the Table of the Lord after their First Eucharist. Let us be hospitable to our children, their families and friends by being inviting as were the two disciples at

Emmaus pressing "the stranger" to share a meal. Please continue to pray for the children preparing to celebrate First Eucharist on the weekends of 13/14 May, 20/21 May and 27/28 May.

OUR PRAYERFUL SYMPATHY:

- we offer to the family of Bortolo "Ben" Benzone who entered eternal life at Goonawarra Aged Facility. Born in 1916, Ben was conscripted into the Italian Mountain Soldiers, the Alpini. He was captured in Greece in 1941 and sent to Australia as a POW. He worked on farms in Lancefield. In 1949, he brought his wife to Victoria. They were blessed with three daughters. Ben became a beef cattle farmer in Romsey. He lived in his own house until he was 99 years old. His Funeral was celebrated on Wednesday.

MINISTRY MONTH This weekend, we will hear of the great work done in our parish by so many. All the Parish Groups and Ministries are vital to the parish we have today. These are various groups within our Church community who support our parish. We welcome all parishioners to be involved in any way they feel would bring richness to their life and the lives of other parishioners.

ALTAR CARE: To clean the Sanctuary space of the church on a roster basis.

ALTAR SERVERS: To assist priest with Mass. Open to boys and girls who have celebrated First Communion.

<u>BAPTISM PREPARATION</u>: To welcome and instruct families wanting to baptize their children in the Catholic Faith. Sessions run once per month for 1 hour.

BINGO HELPER: To help with running the parish bingo at the Sunbury Football Club every Thursday night.

<u>CATECHETICS</u>: Our parish runs a program for children who attend Government schools who would like to celebrate their Sacraments. We need leaders who will support the children and teach them about the faith.

<u>CHILDREN'S LITURGY OF THE WORD</u>: To help children learn about their faith by running faith sessions <u>at Mass</u> that are directed toward children, including activities.

<u>CHURCH CLEANING:</u> Help is needed at both St Anne's and Our Lady of Mount Carmel churches to keep them clean.

CHURCH LINEN: Each Mass uses Altar Linen. We need helpers to wash and iron the linen.

<u>COMMUNION TO THE HOUSEBOUND & AGED CARE FACILITIES</u>: This important ministry helps parishioners who can no longer get to Mass by bringing communion and a friendly face to them. Some ministers attend to those at home and others attend the Nursing Homes.

COUNTING TEAM: We need people to count money and get it ready for banking.

EMMAUS CHARISMATIC PRAYER GROUP: Is held every Thursday morning in the Chapel and is open to all who would like to pray in an uplifting environment.

EVERGREENS: Our Seniors are always looking for people to join them as they arrange gatherings and outings.

<u>GARDENING</u>: Our gardens need love and attention. Our helpers do a great job and would appreciate any assistance available.

GIFT SHOP: After Mass at St Anne's our helpers open the gift shop. Helpers are on a roster.

KNIGHTS OF THE SOUTHERN CROSS: An organization of catholic men who support the educational, charitable, religious and social welfare needs of the parish.
