THE LIMITATIONS OF JESUS OF NAZARETH

Jesus worked within his human limits. In today's gospel Jesus withdraws with his small group of disciples to the coastal region of Tyre and Sidon (part of modern day Lebanon). He is in gentile territory. He has physically removed himself from the place of his very active ministry and takes a break. He intends to have a restful retreat, but his tranquillity is shattered when a Canaanite women bursts on the scene. She, an outsider representing the gentile people, loudly pleads with Jesus to cure her demon-possessed daughter. Matthew uses the woman's story to reflect the history of the first fifty years of the church as it turned increasingly towards the gentile nations. By the time Matthew's gospel was written, St Paul, the Apostle of the Gentiles, had done his work and had been martyred in Rome. The gentile mission was well on its way.

The mission of Jesus had been limited to a short period of time (3 years) and confined to the Jews. We get a strong hint of this limitation in the observation that he answered the Canaanite woman not a word. Jesus did not respond to the woman's entreaties, but she continued to follow him and to plead her cause. Finally, the disciples, feeling that the woman was a nuisance, asked Jesus to give her what she wanted and be rid of her. It is then that Jesus made this statement: 'I was sent only to the lost sheep of the house of Israel' (Mt 15:24). The reason Jesus made that statement was because he was aware of the restrictions his human condition placed upon his mission.

The short and limited mission of Jesus provided the first circle of ripples made by a pebble cast into the lake. It was the task of the disciples to expand that ripple effect. The early mission of Jesus with few exceptions was directed to the Jews. Jesus accepted his human condition and the limitations it placed on his mission. He was confined to a small territory and restricted to the pace his disciples could cope with. There is always a tension between one's great vision and the slow pace in which that vision can be realised.

The early church experienced a similar tension as it grappled with the wider vision which stretched beyond the Jews to gentile faith seekers. Eventually, through Paul's efforts and the gathering of the first church council, the Council of Jerusalem (Acts chapter 15), the church found a way to move forward into its universal mission. Matthew's gospel reflects this movement into gentile mission which had already gathered pace. It is the only gospel that carries the story of the wise men from the east who came to visit the new-born king (Mt 2:1-12). Matthew's gospel ends with Jesus sending his apostles to 'go, make disciples of all nations, baptise them in them in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit, and teach them to observe all the commands I gave you.' (cf Mt 28:16-20)

In the course of his gospel Matthew wrote how Jesus proclaimed the ideal of the kingdom. He tells how Jesus worked closely with his chosen apostles to make them ministers of the kingdom. The church would be the means of the kingdom spreading throughout the world. The ministry of Jesus was confined to Jewish territory, but the ministry of the church community would extend to embrace all nations.

CONCERT IN BOMBED OUT CATHEDRAL: Last month, a thousand people gathered in the roof-less Catholic Cathedral in Aleppo, Syria while hundreds more outside looked on screens for their first concert in five years. The concert was Mozart's Mass in C, given by Christian and Muslim singers and musicians.

NEW CARDINAL SENT TO BE PEACE MAKER: Recently Pope Francis has sent Cardinal Jose Chavez of El Salvador to negotiate between North and South Korea. During the civil war in El Salvador between 1979 and 1992, the then Bishop Chavez worked as a mediator between the warring factions. Chavez was a close associate of Archbishop Oscar Remero who was assassinated for supporting the poor while celebrating Mass in 1980. Bishop Chavez is the first assistant bishop to be made a cardinal.
