ADVENT SYMBOLS

The Advent Wreath

One of the most captivating symbols used in Advent is the Advent Wreath. It is usually made of evergreen branches formed into a circle. It holds four candles: three purple (or dark blue) and one pink. The pink candle is lit on the third Sunday of Advent. The third Sunday is called 'GAUDETE SUNDAY'. The Latin word 'gaudete' is translated into English as 'rejoice'. There is good reason to rejoice because the joyful feast of Christmas is ever so close. Some wreaths, like ours, have a fifth candle, a white one to be lit on the feast of Christmas. The three purple candles symbolize the time of preparation. Some parishes use dark blue candles instead of purple to differentiate Advent from Lent. Lent is a penitential season, whereas Advent is a season of preparation for the feast of Christmas and joyful anticipation of Christ's coming. But even in the season of Lent, on the fourth Sunday, 'Laetare Sunday', we are reminded to be people of joy. Like 'gaudete' 'laetare' means 'rejoice'. Even in a penitential season a Christian must not be gloomy. The reason for being joyful is that the great mystery of our redemption, 'the paschal mystery', the saving death and resurrection of Jesus, is drawing near. The Advent wreath is lit at the beginning of each of the four Advent Sunday Masses. Some families and religious communities make a small Advent wreath for devotional use at home or in their religious house-chapel.

The Jesse Tree

The Jesse Tree receives its name from Jesse, the father of King David, from whose house the lineage of Jesus can be traced through his earthly father, Joseph, a descendant of David. The gospels of Matthew and Luke contain genealogies, lists of ancestors. Matthew 1:1-17 traces Jesus' lineage back to Abraham. Luke 3:23-38 traces Jesus' lineage back to Adam. Both gospels mention Jesse and David. Matthew has a descending genealogy whereas Luke's is ascending. Not every ancestor is mentioned, of course, because the primary aim is to connect Jesus to Abraham and Adam in the respective gospels. However, as I pointed out above, Jesse and his son David are included in both genealogies as vital links. In Luke's gospel of the annunciation, the angel Gabiel's words to Mary regarding the son she is to bear are these, 'He will be great, and will be called Son of the Most High, and the Lord God will give to him the throne of his ancestor David' (Lk 1:32).

It is not my intention to teach you how to construct a Jesse Tree. Google can do that for you if you are interested. Here I want to offer you a selection of symbols which are sometimes found pinned or attached to a Jesse Tree.

ADVENT LITURGICAL COLOURS

The traditional liturgical colour for the season of Advent is purple or violet. However, it has become customary in some local churches to substitute a dark blue to replace violet as the colour for Advent. The purpose for the practice of using dark blue for Advent is to distinguish Advent from Lent. The theme of Advent is not penitential. Advent is a time of waiting and of joyful anticipation for Christ's coming. Advent is not to be considered as a *'Little Lent'*. On the 3rd Sunday of Advent the priest wears rose coloured vestments and a rose candle is lit.

During Advent you are invited to spend some time in quiet reflection. St Anne's Chapel will be set aside for reflective prayer between 8.30am & 10.30am Masses on each Sunday of Advent and after 9.15am Mass& 2.30pm-3.15pm each Wednesday.

BLUE CHRISTMAS: This Blue Christmas service is for anyone for whom Christmas is a time when they feel 'blue' while everyone else seems to be celebrating. People may fee 'blue' because of the loss of a loved one, because of a relationship breakdown, because of stresses in their lives, because family are a long distance away, because they are lonely or because of sad memories of past experiences of Christmas or for any other reason.

This time of reflection, listen to music, prayer and lighting of candles provides an opportunity to express these feelings before Christmas with others who are also feeling 'blue'.
