THE GAZE OF JESUS

Last Sunday I drew your attention to a part of the gospel that often goes unnoticed. In John's gospel we read 'John (the Baptist) stared hard at Jesus.' Further on in the same gospel passage we read, 'Jesus looked hard at Simon'. In the snippet of Mark's gospel served up for the Third Sunday in Ordinary Time, we read, 'As he was walking along the Sea of Galilee Jesus saw Simon and his brother Andrew casting a net into the lake – for they were fishermen.' Further on we read, 'Going a little further Jesus saw James son of Zebedee and his brother John...' Jesus calls the two sets of brothers to follow him, and all four promptly leave their nets, their boats, their fising gear, and their family and follow Jesus without the slightest hesitation. It is suggested that they responded not only to the voice of Jesus but to his piercing gaze and beckoning eyes. St John of the Cross said, 'For Jesus, to see is to love.' Yes, 'For Jesus, to see is to love.'

In his book, *The Impact of God,* Soundings from St John of the Cross, lain Matthew provides us with a special chapter, **The Gospel has Eyes** (Chapter 5). He writes:

Imagine sitting on a quiet bench in the park, between some flower beds and backed by a hedge. ...composing quite a personal letter, absorbed and writing...Someone is there – you notice out of the corner of your eye – someone is there looking at you, and has been for quite some time. What a moment of exposure!

The gospel has eyes – 'The eyes I long for so', John of the Cross calls them – and the point comes on the journey when the bride meets those eyes which had been looking on: 'It seems to her that he is always gazing upon her.' It is a moment of exposure as she finds herself a factor in another's life and heart.

It takes a saint, a mystic and a poet to discover the depth of Christ's love. Very few Catholics and Christians have come to the realization that Jesus looks on them with a deep passionate personal love. Later on in the Year of Mark, the Twenty-Eighth Sunday in Ordinary Time, we will come across the episode of the rich young man who is called by Jesus to follow him and leave his wealth behind (Mk 10: 17-27), but the man clings to his wealth. In that episode we read, 'Jesus looked steadily at him and loved him.' lain Matthew continues his theme on the 'Gospel Has Eyes'. He writes...

So the gospel has eyes which are not dispassionate, nor merely passive. Their gaze is not an art-gallery gaze, wandering from exhibit to exhibit and leaving what they see obviously unchanged. Their gaze engages what they see and affects it. "For God, to gaze is to love" and to bestow favours. (You are my son/daughter: my favour rests on you.) Gospel eyes are effective: 'God's gaze works four favours in the soul: it cleanses the person, makes her beatiful, enriches and enlightens her.'

St John of the Cross, with St Theresa of Avila, is probably the greatest Carmelite saint in the history of that contemplative Order. His image of a loving God suggests a refreshing way of looking at the Christian life. 'Christianity is an effect,' says lain Matthew, 'the effect of a God who is constantly gazing at us, whose eyes anticipate, radiate, penetrate and elicit beauty.' What a beautiful image of God is that! How different it is from the ugly 'eye in the sky', the God who is like a cop wanting to catch us out breaking his law, ready to punish us! Let always remember: "For God, to see is to love."
