THE CLEANSING-PAST & PRESENT

Our gospel today (John 2:13-26) fits in very well with our Parish's theme for Lent: "Washing the Dust off our souls", chosen by our Liturgy Planning Team last week.

The Cleansing of the Temple

The day after Christ's triumphant entry into Jerusalem on Palm Sunday, Jesus went to the Temple. Those entering needed to pay the Temple tax used for the upkeep of the Temple and to buy the animals to be sacrificed to God. The Roman coins had the head of Caesarwho considered himself divine- were hence not accepted so they were changed for Jewish coins. However, the money-changers cheated people. The animal sellers made a great profit for the family of the high priest. As the great Scottish theologian, William Barclay wrote, "In all this, the poor struggling pilgrims who came to worship the Father, were being oppressed and that is what Jesus detested. So Jesus drove the sellers all out of the Temple." Jesus heard the cry of the poor.

The Cleansing of our Church: In 1960, St John XXIII prayed for a new Pentecost which we associate with wind and fire. The Second Vatican Council (1962-65) breathed fresh air into the Church. We were to see Christ's teaching in a fresh way, the Pope said, "With patience" if necessary. At the Council, the bishops taught the Church must be a reformer, but she is always in need of being reformed.

Like the Jerusalem Temple, we have been sullied by commerce and worldly attachments. Lent is the season of our cleansing. This is the time to restore prayer and holiness to our

After the Resurrection: Jesus is asked his authority for cleansing the Temple. His Resurrection is the authority. "Destroy this sanctuary and in three days I will raise it up." (John 2:19) Jesus' death marks the end of the Jerusalem Temple and its worship. He introduces a new worship in a Temple not built of human hands. The new Temple is his Body- the Risen Onewho will gather the peoples of the earth and unite them in the sacrament of his Body and Blood.

The Church Must Discuss Family Living: Cardinal Blasé Cupich of Chicago recently said: "The problem-and it's a major one— is this. We are not meeting the needs of real people. We can't be self-satisfied. The most pernicious temptation we have in the Church is to give in to the feeling that 'we have arrived.' Pope Francis is trying to jar us out of that."

Pope Francis' exhortation "The Joy of Love" is a new paradigm of Catholicity, says Cupich. "It's something I've lived: something I've experienced." "You can't teach unless you're ready to learn. And you can't learn unless you are ready to listen. What the Pope does so dramatically in "Joy of Love" is to show, through the whole of Scripture in one story after another, how God has chosen family life as a privileged way in which we see who God is and what God is doina."

Cardinal Cupich is a member of the Congregation of Bishops who will advise the Pope on the appointment of our next archbishop this year.

LITURGY TEAM MEETING: Wednesday 21 February, the liturgy team met for the first time this year. The team plan and support parish liturgical celebrations using resources provided by Melbourne and other Australian Dioceses.

We reviewed the Christmas celebrations— each Mass, prayer/ reflection session and reconciliation.

Again, we reviewed the omission of the recessional hymn at Mass. Once dismissed in prayer, our community is encouraged to interact with one another within our Church. This is not a sign of disrespect but being sent forth "in communion" and living out the Eucharist. Lastly, our Parish Lenten focus is "Washing the dust from our Souls". A challenge for us to clear our hearts and souls of 'debris'- a spring clean as we prepare to recommit ourselves at Easter.
