THE WASHING OF THE FEET

The roads of Palestine were dust-bowls in the dry summer and mud-holes in the wet. The footwear of ordinary people was a flimsy pair of sandals. These gave little protection against the dust and mud. For that reason there were always great waterpots at the door of a house; and a servant was there with a basin and a towel to wash the soiled feet of the guests as they entered the house. Jesus' little company of friends had no servants. So Jesus took the part of the servant and went about washing his disciples' feet. After washing their feet Jesus said to his disciples, 'Do you understand what I have done to you? You call me teacher and Lord. If then I, your teacher and Lord, have washed your feet, so ought you to wash each other's feet, for I have given you an example, that as I have done to you, you should do to each other.'

In my ten years in Sunbury I haven't seen anybody physically washing anybody else's feet, except on the Holy Thursday ritual which comes round once a year. But Jesus was not telling us to go through a ritual, nor was he suggesting that we go about literally washing each other's feet. His message goes much deeper than that. The washing of feet was a humble servant's job. Jesus was telling us to give humble, loving service to each other.

Now, here is what I have seen. One day I was shopping at Aldi. A kind lady offered to help me. She helped me put the groceries into my trolley. Then she told me to wait for her so she could help me put the groceries into the boot of the car. She then took the trolley and came back with my dollar. Another day I had my washing ready to be put on the clothes line, but I had to rush off to Mass. When I returned from Mass I found a Brother had hung out the washing for me. That same afternoon I had to go for an x-ray. When I came back my washing was there at my door neatly folded. This white alb that I'm wearing: one of you washed it for me. God bless that person. I could go on and on. I'm sure you have caught my drift. Those little acts of loving service are all examples of what Jesus said when he commanded us to wash each other's feet. The person who washes and irons your clothes at home; the person who shops for the family; the person who cooks the family meal; the person who cleans the family home... aren't these people obeying the Lord's injunction?

The people who take communion to the sick; the people who clean our church; the people who spend time with a lonely person; the people who do voluntary work for the community; the people who do things for others... aren't these people doing what Christ is asking of them?

How does the song go? 'Brother, sister, let me be your servant, let me be as Christ to you...' Jesus said 'The greatest among you must be your servant.'

This servant bit: we are doing it already. The washing of the feet hasn't stopped. Let us keep doing what we are doing. Let us put more love into it. Let us put more humility into it. Then, by our love and humble service to each other, people will know that we are genuinely Christian.

ONE FEAST OVER THREE DAYS: is the summit of our year of worship. Our feast begins on Holy Thursday when we gather at 7.30pm to recall the Lord's supper with his disciples when he instituted the Eucharist and taught us to serve each other by washing each other's feet.

On Good Friday at 3pm, the second day centres on Christ's saving sacrifice on the Cross. We take part in a dialogue reading of the Sacred Passion from John's Gospel. The service concludes with Holy Communion.

On Saturday evening, the third day begins at 8pm with a fire outside St Anne's Church. The fire represents the light of Christ conquering the darkness of death by his Resurrection. Once inside, we listen to the works of our saving God from the Sacred Scriptures. We receive a new member, Ben Ellis, into the Church through Baptism and Confirmation and then we celebrate the Eucharist.

CHRISM MASS: On Tuesday at 11am at the Cathedral, the Archbishop and over a hundred priests will celebrate the Chrism Mass during which the Sacred Oils are consecrated for the Sacrament of Baptism, Confirmation and the Anointing of the Sick. The priests renew the vows of their ordination. You are welcome to this Mass which will be the last Chrism Mass presided over by Archbishop Denis before his retirement. Please pray for our new archbishop.

HOLY TRINITY SCHOOL: Project Coordination Meeting will be held at the Catholic Education Centre, East Melbourne on Tuesday at 2pm.
