THOMAS

Thomas is only mentioned once in each of the synoptic gospels: Mark 3:18; Matthew 10:3; and Luke 6:15. In each case Thomas' name is listed among others as one of the chosen twelve apostles. Nothing else is said about him. But in John's gospel Thomas is not just a name: he plays a significant role in the story of Jesus. In the story of the raising of Lazarus, after Jesus indicated his intention to go to Jerusalem - a very dangerous place indeed - Thomas said to his frightened fellow disciples, "Let us go and die with him." (Jn 11:16) Thomas, always the practical one, asks Jesus, "Lord, we do not know where you are going, so how can we know the way?" (Jn

The apostle Thomas has been given the nickname Doubting Thomas, but Thomas was not the only doubter of the resurrection. Doubt seemed to have been widespread. Easter Saturday's gospel, read in churches and chapels around the world, makes this very clear. The gospel writer is Mark: he writes...

Having risen in the morning on the first day of the week, Jesus appeared first to Mary of Magdala from whom he had cast out seven devils. She then went to those who had been his companions and those who were mourning and in tears and told them. But they would not believe her when they heard her say that he was alive and that she had seen him. After this, he showed himself under another form to two of them as they were on their way into the country. These went back and told the others, who did not believe them either, Lastly, he showed himself to the Eleven themselves while they were at table. He reproached them for their incredulity and obstinacy, because they had refused to believe those who had seen him after he had risen.

Every gospel carries stories of doubt and unbelief. Those who had seen Jesus mercilessly scourged; seen him crowned with thorns; seen him struggling to carry his cross and falling over several times; seen him crucified; and seen the soldier pierce his heart with a lance; and seen him dead and buried...to them a risen Christ beggared belief.

Amidst all this unbelief, Thomas stands out. The story in John's gospel is so dramatic and so vividly told, that it tops all the other stories. However, in the end, Thomas' profession of faith surpasses all others. No one can beat Thomas' proclamation, 'My Lord and my God.'

What I admire about Thomas is his honesty. He didn't pretend to believe just because others expected it of him. He stood against the rest, the odd man out. Jesus must have loved Thomas greatly to come again just for Thomas' sake. The author of the fourth gospel uses the story of Thomas to serve the purpose of his gospel, a gospel written to get people to believe in Jesus. John was writing to a people who had not seen the Risen Lord. He wanted them to believe the word of those who were privileged witnesses of the resurrected Christ. "Blessed are those who have not seen and vet believe." (Jn 20:29)

13 March was the fifth anniversary of Pope Francis' election. He now has 44.9 million Twitter followers. Among his famous sayings are: "I see the Church as a field hospital after battle." "To be faithful, to be creative, we need to be able to change." Walls solve nothing. We must build bridges." "I like it when someone tells me "I don't agree". This is a true collaborator."



SOME KEYS TO UNDERSTAND POPE FRANCIS:

- His reform of the papcacy. He lives simply in Santa Marta guesthouse, not in a palace, is driven in a small Ford sedan and has kept contact with his friends.
- 2. He has decentralized the Church. Power has moved from the centre, the Vatican, to local bishops' conferences. They can now decide on translations of the
- 3. His focus is on the "peripheries"- he visits remote, conflict-ridden parts of the world, creates cardinals from a nation which never had a cardinal.
- 4. He has ensured there is open discussion at Synods of Bishops. He wants a synodal Church that "Walks together– priest and laity– to strengthen its mission"
- 5. Everyone, including himself is a work in progress, in need of repentance and reform in the spirit.
- Rome remains important, but as a coordinating hub, helping to share ideas and coordinating major gatherings that address global problems, eg human trafficking and inter-faith dialogues.
- 7. With Brexit, with US "America first" and nationalist ... political movements, Pope Francis has been a standard bearer for the compassionate internationalist post-war political consensus. His foreign policy is rooted in a "diplomacy of mercy" that "never loses hope".

Cardinal Oscar Rodrigues a Salesian bishop who has visited Salesian College Sunbury is one of Pope Francis' closest advisors. He said in early March, "The Church does not have a reverse gear, it can only go forward."
